2,000 Catholic Youth Meet At St. Dunstan's

More than 2,000 attended a gathering of young people from Queen's and King's Counties at St. Dunstan's Basilica Sunday afternoon where Rev. James Conroy, associate editor of the Sunday Visitor, Huntington, Indiana, spoke on the problems facing the youth of today.

Including the youth from fourteen years of age to twenty-four, the gathering was a culmination of Catholic Youth Week which began on Monday with special evening Masses at St. Dunstan's Basilica, the Church of the Most Holy Redeemer, and other churches throughout the diocese.

Father Conroy, who arrived in the Province on Friday, gave

talks over CFCY-Radio and T.V. and over CJRW, Summerside, on Saturday afternoon he addressed a large gathering of youth from Prince County at Civic Stadium, Summerside, and Saturday night spoke to an assembly of parents. Thomson Tartan Comes To Canada

EDINBURGH, Scotland — The many Thomsons throughout the world - no matter how they spell their name - now have a tartan of their own. The tartan, which is the first new family plaid approved for a great many decades, grew out of research conducted by Roy Thomson, Canadian-born newspaper proprietor and has been made available in Canada.

Originally a sept of the MacTavish clan, the Thomson family has grown in importance over the years, and after extensive research, the Lord Lyon—whose word is law in such matters in Scotland—agreed that the Thomsons should have a tartan of their own. Two designs have been officially registered and approved, the Thomson hunting tartan which is basically brown, and the Thomson dress tartan in blue.

Cloth manufacturers in Scotland have been enthusiastic about the new tartans, and now the tartans are available across Canada through Eaton stores. Whether it is Thomson, Thompson, or any other form of the name, the family now has the right to don this identification.
