P. W. C. Teacher Addresses Montreal Group

MONTREAL - Miss Helen Yeo, B.A., M.Ed., of the staff of Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, and a member of the Board of Governors of the Prince Edward Island Teachers' Federation was a guest speaker here on Thursday night at the annual convention of the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers.

Miss Yeo, who is a graduate of Harvard University, addressed the senior elementary section on "Grouping for reading in the senior grades," illustrating various points by using pupils in tableaux.

Stressing the individual differences in children, Miss Yeo indicated the need of letting them progress naturally as they mature, and pointed out the value of grouping of children who are comparatively of the same level of mental maturity. "This grouping must be flexible, permitting a child to move from one group to another in the classroom, as change in progress is seen," she said.
