To Honour Scout Heroes

Canada's Chief Scout, the Right Honourable Vincent Massey, C. H.

will present gallantry awards to 14 Scout heroes at Government House, Ottawa, on December 1st. The Victoria Cross of Scouting, known as the Cornwell Badge, will be awarded to one Scout. There will be two posthumous awards of Bronze Crosses; two boys will receive Silver Crosses and nine will get Gift Crosses.

Awards in recognition of outstanding service to the Boy Scout Movement will be presented to 11 adults.

**Still Going Ahead**

Canada's Boy Scouts Association membership is nearing the 140,000 mark. At the latest Quarterly census (Sept. 30) there were 77,980 Wolf Cubs, 45,250 Boy Scouts, 710 Sea Scouts, 673 Lone Scouts, 2505 Rover Scouts, 117 Rover Sea Scouts and 12,699 leaders, a total of 139,934.

**Adopt Holger Nielson Method**

Teaching of the Holger Nielson method of artificial respiration to Canada's Boy Scouts, in addition to the Schaefter Method, has been approved by the Executive Committee of the Canadian General Council of the Boy Scouts Association.

This action follows adoption of the Holger Nielson method by the St. John Ambulance Association, the Royal Lifesaving Society and the Canadian Red Cross Society.

**Honours Manitoba Queen's Scouts**

At an impressive ceremony in Manitoba's Legislative Building in Winnipeg, Canada's Chief Scout, the Right Honourable Vincent Massey, C. H., recently presented Queen's Scouts certificates to 73 Scouts from various sections of the province.

**"B.-P.'s Life in Pictures"**

A fascinating book with the above title is now available from Canadian Scout Headquarters. Each of the fifty-three quarto pages contains five or six sketches of incidents in the life of Lord Baden-Powell or Gilwell, Founder of the Boy Scout Movement which now has a world membership of over five million. These drawings are most vivid and the artist has been particularly successful in capturing B.-P.'s likeness and expression.

**Soviet Sport Paper Reports Baseball Crisis**

MOSCOW, Nov. 17 (AP)—The Soviet newspaper, "Soviet Sport," announced Thursday that American "beizbol" is in a serious crisis. "Beizbol" is the way the word baseball is translated into Russian.

The newspaper also claimed that Brenge Rikki (apparently the reference is to Branch Rickey) also owns the major league clubs.

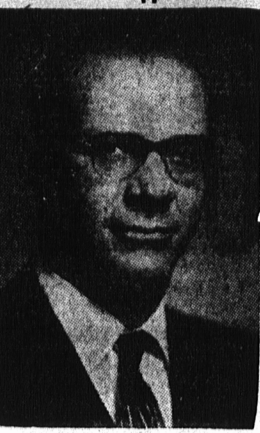
Sport repeated a claim made in the Russian magazine "Smena" several months ago that beizbol had its origin in a Russian village game called "lapta."

The crisis in beizbol—Sport said—results from the fact that U. S. sports fans are tired of seeing "mercilessly cripple each other."

Other claims were the American national game typifies the "ugly character of sport in the United States."

While declaring beizbol is an Americanized version of lapta, Sport said, "at the same time

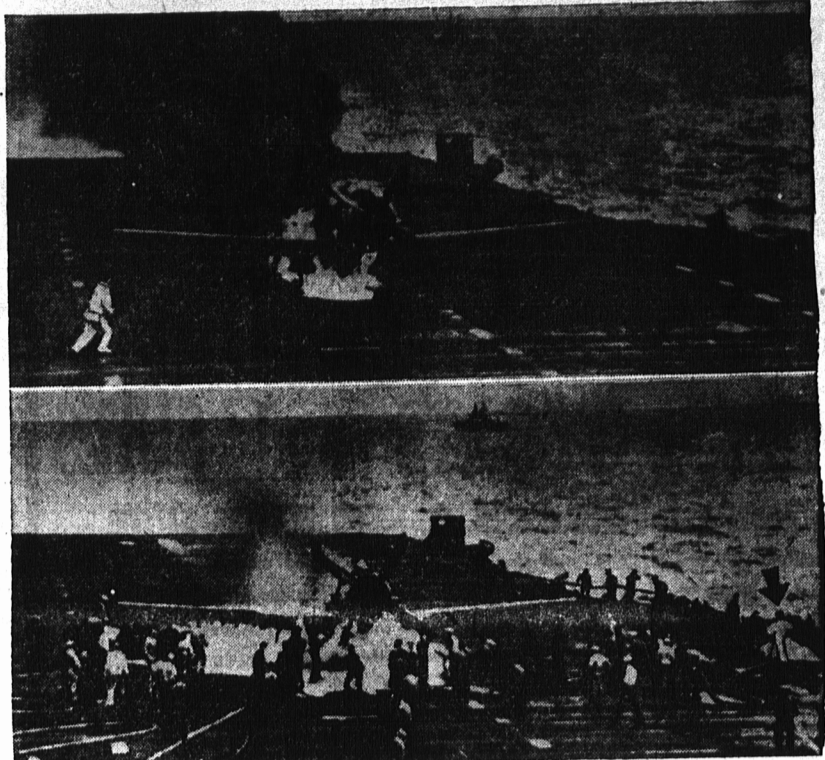

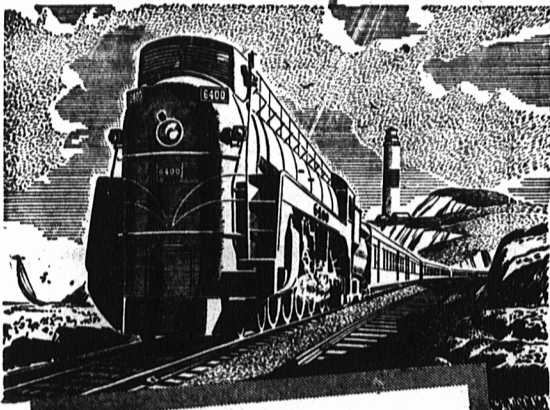
