Function Of Lawyer Must Be Preserved

Socialized law would be a retrograde step, Walter S. Owen, Q.C., president of the Canadian Bar Association, told the Law Society of Prince Edward Island and P.E.I. branch of the Canadian Bar Association at a dinner last evening at the Charlottetown Hotel.

Mr. Owen spoke on "The Law" going into the delicate relationship between the lawyer and his client, the court, and society. He emphasized that an important aspect of the legal profession is the duty of defending unpopular causes. Everyone accused of a crime, he pointed out, is entitled to be defended by counsel, no matter how infamous he may be personally or how unpopular his cause.

Pointing out that a lawyer is bound to defend a client regardless of his belief in the client's guilt or innocence, Mr. Owen recalled that in British Columbia there had been several recent cases in which individuals had tried to plead guilty to murder, which in fact they were not.

Mr. Owen is accompanied on his tour of the various Canadian law societies by Mrs. Owen and their daughter Daphne.

Gilbert A. Gaudet, Q.C., president of the Law Society of Prince Edward Island, presided at the dinner, which was held at the Charlottetown Hotel. Mr. Owen was introduced by Robert S. Hinton, Q.C., vice-president for Prince Edward Island of the Canadian Bar Association; and thanked by M. Alban Farmer, Q.C.

The Owens leave for New Brunswick this morning and will visit a number of other provincial law societies before returning to their home in Vancouver.

Cement Arrives At Summerside

SUMMERSIDE — The M.V. Keta from Newfoundland is unloading a cargo of 15,000 bags of cement at Summerside. The cargo which was loaded at Cornerbrook is destined for the Portland cement company in Summerside and Charlottetown.

This is the third cargo of cement to be unloaded at Island ports this summer, and a spokesman for the Island agents says the provincial government is giving every encouragement to this inter-change of trade between the two provinces.

The Keta will load 200 tons of Island potatoes for Newfoundland ports after her cargo is discharged.

Summerside Men Will Stand Trial

SUMMERSIDE — Two Summerside men, Alfred Daniel Cahill and Albert Clair Gallant have been committed to stand trial at the next session of the Supreme Court. They are charged with robbery with violence.

The pair were committed at the conclusion of a preliminary hearing before Magistrate R.S. Hinton, Q.C., in Summerside police court. Both have elected trial by judge and jury.

Cahill and Gallant are free on bail. They are charged with beating William MacEwen and robbing him of between \$250 and \$300 which he claims he had on his person at the time of his encounter with the pair, June 17th. J. Watson MacNaught, Q.C., and Alexander Campbell are defence counsel and D.O. Stewart Q.C. was the crown prosecutor.
