(3 Eggs)

1 cup sifted Swans Down Cake Flour
1 tsp. Calumet Baking Powder
1/4 tsp. salt
1/2 cup hot milk

1/4 tsp. mace
2 eggs, unbeaten
2 cups sugar
2 tbsps. shortening
1/2 cup hot milk

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, salt and mace. Sift together three times. Beat eggs with rotary egg beater until they are foamy and beat in sugar gradually until very thick and light. Add shortening to hot milk and heat until melted; then add to egg mixture, mixing quickly. Add all flour and lemon rind and beat with rotary egg beater until smooth. Turn into 8-inch layer pan 1 1/2 inches deep, which has been lined on bottom with paper, but not greased. Bake in moderate oven (375 deg. F.) about 15 minutes. Cool in pan. Spread cake in thin, spread whipped cream or custard filling between halves. Sift powdered sugar over top of cake.

LONDON, Oct. 4 — (Reuters) — A Czechoslovak civil airlines plane carrying refugees landed at an airport in Southeast Britain Saturday, the Air Ministry announced tonight. An Air Ministry official said this was the second Czech aircraft to land at the airport — Manston, Kent — under similar circumstances in 12 months.

U. K. Fears Flood Of Divorce Cases

LONDON, Oct. 4 — Some lawyers fear that a lot of Britons who couldn't afford it before may rush to the courts for divorce after the Labor Government's new Legal Aid Bill goes into effect tomorrow.

The bill, put through by the Labor Government as part of its socialization program, offers Britain's poorer classes full or partial financial assistance in taking their legal disputes before the high court and the court of appeals.

Exceptions are slander, libel, breach of promise and a few minor categories. The plan is expected to cost the taxpayers upwards of £1,000,000 (\$3,100,000) a year.

Originally planned on a much wider scope, the law was watered down considerably prior to its enactment by Parliament last year. In its present form it won the support of all parties.

Even the lawyers like it, but some of them believe it might lead a lot of people to the courts for divorces they previously could not afford. Divorce cases are heard in high court.

Lawsuits in the county courts, where the majority of civil cases are instituted, are not covered. Legal aid in criminal cases has long been in effect here.

Unlike the costly National Health Service, Britons will not be taxed directly to pay for the legal aid service. It does not apply to the wealthy as well as the poor, as does the big medical service program. Only those who would be hard hit financially by expensive court procedure will benefit.

It does not put Britain's lawyers under governmental control. The Government will foot the bill, but supervision of the scheme is left to the Law Society (the British version of the Canadian Bar Association).

Anyone earning less than £3 a weeks gets full free legal assistance. All costs, including his lawyer's fee, are paid by the Government. The average wage earner getting £12 a week is eligible for partial assistance. The amount he must pay out of his own pocket is based on
