WARREN HASTINGS WRECK.
Discipline of the British.

A despatch to the London Daily Telegraph from Port Louis, Island of Mauritius, furnishes particulars of the British Indian troopship Warren Hastings, which was wrecked off the Island of Reunion, on Thursday, January 14, without loss of life. It appears that the ship was on a voyage of 2,200 miles. It was pitch dark and torrents of rain were falling. She had on board besides soldiers and crew a number of women and children, the families of the married men of the military forces. When the ship struck the rocks they were ordered to retire from the upper deck, to which they had flopped on the first alarm, and to fall below. This they did promptly, the most perfect discipline prevailing, although the men were fully conscious of the danger they were in. They were quietly mustered on the 'ween decks without confusion or excitement. Owing to the fact that the surf broke could not be used in Warren Hastings, two officers of the ship were taken to the rocks, and when it was found that a landing could be effected in this way, the disembarkation of the officers was commenced at 4 o'clock. Commander Holland hoped it was safe to retain the women, children and the sick on board until daylight. But the troopship was soon found to be heeling over so rapidly that everyone was ordered to the upper deck, the danger of capsizing being imminent. Thereupon Commander Holland ordered the landing of the troops to be stopped, in order that the women, children and sick persons should be landed immediately. This order was obeyed with admirable discipline. By 5 o'clock the decks had heeled over to an angle of 50 degrees to starboard, and the boats were all swept away. The good swimmers were then permitted to swim ashore, carrying ropes. By these means many others were landed, and the disembarkation of all on board was completed by 5.30 a.m., with the loss of only two native servants. Many acts of bravery were recorded. The French officials and inhabitants of the Island of Reunion gave the shipwrecked people every assistance possible.

CANADA'S NATIONAL DEBT.
(Montreal Gazette.)

The Consolidated Fund is only one, though the greatest, of the expenditure accounts. There has been, in the past year, a large outlay on account of capital, that is of borrowed money. Most of this has gone into public works or railway aid. Through-subsidies make the gross expenditure included the following items:

These sum, with \$330,551 to make up the deficit, and \$2,394,000, Quebec Railway subsidy, and \$137,195, Quebec to Consolidated Fund, make the gross increase of the debt during the year \$7,481,335. Sinking Fund investments of \$2,056,287, and \$542 refund of Northwest rebellion expenses reduced the total to \$5,425,048, which represents the gross increase in the national indebtedness of the year. The Quebec Railway subsidy item does not, however, represent a net liability. Its entry was merely a recognition of an obligation created thirteen years ago at the time of the North Shore Railway deal. The average increase in the public debt since Confederation has been \$6,400,000 a year, so that in 1895-96, the last year of a Conservative administration, though since the record has been called excessive, neither in regard to the ordinary expenditure or the capital outlay necessitating an increase in the debt. From 1875 to 1878, four years in which a Liberal administration had complete control, both of the estimates and expenditure, the increase of debt was \$2,637,105, or at the rate of \$8,000,000 a year.

Deducting there from the gross debt the net obligations of Canada to various classes of creditors \$258,477,422. The interest charge was in 1895-96 \$10,502,429, or at the rate of 3.23 per cent on the gross, a reduction of 0.6 per cent compared with the rate of 1894-95 and of 0.31 per cent compared with the rate ten years ago. This reduction in the rate of interest, due partly to the general fall in the great money markets, and partly to the confidence of investors in Canada's credit, is one of the most interesting facts connected with the debt, and has been mainly instrumental in enabling the country to carry so easily the heavy load of obligations that it has assumed.

NATIONAL THRIFT.
How to enjoy life and yet be a miser; how to make the most of one's existence and yet not be miserly; these are things worth knowing. Some of the European nations understand better than we on this side of the Atlantic how they are to be done. We have heard it said that the average wage-earner in the United States spends, on the whole, quite comfortably in his active lifetime, to keep him comfortably in his old age, the Dutch, the Swiss, the French, the Germans are the proud providers. They lead happy lives, many of them, but live simply and save a great deal of money. The French are a thrifty nation, and show well what individual thrift does for a nation. In that country nearly everybody saves up something for "a rainy day," even those who are not rich. One-third, the income of persons in the same station of life in America, find means to lay by a part of their income. The French savings-banks have 800,000 depositors, whose average savings reach for a thousand million francs each. Besides this great sum there are thousands of families who have small sums hidden away against a time of trouble. These savings enabled the war indemnity to Germany to be paid with such comparative ease.

It would be well if in Canada and the States the virtue of thrift were inculcated as it is in Scotland and in Continental countries. Even the French schools teach children to save money and give as a prize to a bright pupil, instead of a medal, a savings-bank book with a small sum to the credit of the owner. We do not advise that children should be taught to be miserly, the love of money for its own sake, but they should learn proper economy and simplicity of life. Early habits of providence are likely to be lasting, whereas self-indulgence and extravagance are difficult to shake off. The American people, extravagant as they are, find it almost impossible to live on a small income because they have inherited from their fathers the habit of spending money as if it were a bird in the hand. Let us in Canada be warned in time against wastefulness, and imitate rather the simple and thrifty habits of the older nations.
