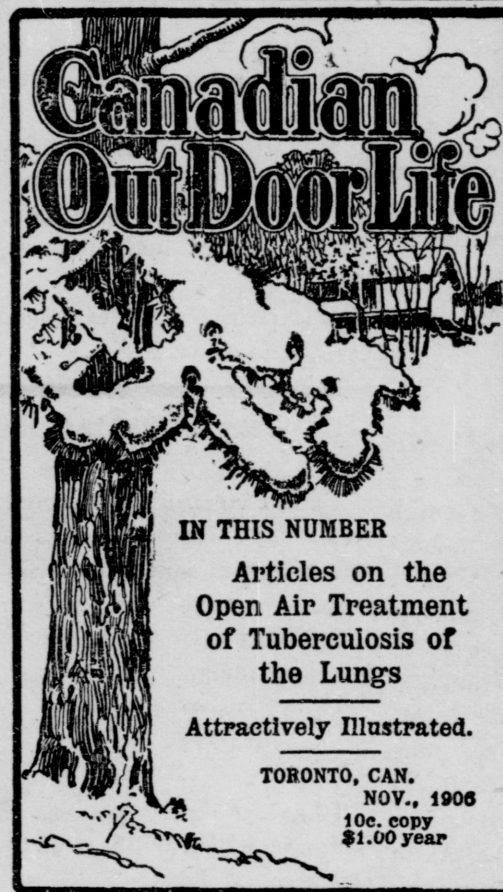
REPARATIONS A LA GARE DU CHEMIN DE FER, TIGNISH.
