### GENERAL GASCOIGNE'S RETIREMENT.

Political Appointments Did Not Please Him.

Toronto, Sept. 21.—An evening paper here says that it is stated in military circles that Major General Gascoigne has been granted an extended leave of absence. This means that he will never return to the command of the Canadian militia. It is alleged that political questions regarding appointments caused the General's retirement.

### THE CAMPAIGN IN INDIA.

Chiefs Wanted a Parley, Which Was Refused.

### ACCURACY OF ENEMY'S FIRE.

SIMLA, Sept. 21.—The latest despatches from General Jeffries report that he advanced again on Sunday morning from the camp at Mayata to attack the enemy west of the valleys. The chiefs came for a parley, but were informed that they could not be heard until all their arms had been surrendered.

A remarkable feature of the campaign is the accuracy of the enemy's fire. Lieut. Crawford was killed at a range of over 1,000 yards.

### Big Mill Burned.

OTTAWA, Sept. 21.—Hurdman's mill, Hull, was totally destroyed by fire last night. The loss is one hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

Tramps boarded the cab, pulled out the trolley and the train ran away. She collided with a west-bound freight with the runaway going at terrific speed. Seven freight cars and two engines were wrecked, one man killed and two injured. Three of the tramps were arrested.

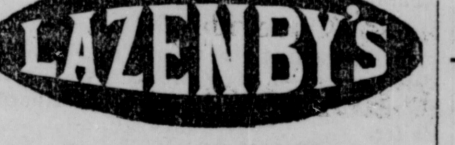
