Department Store Sales Up In 1951

OTTAWA, Feb. 1 (CP)—Department-store sales in 1951 were 2.4 per cent higher than in 1950, the Bureau of Statistics reported today.
The total for 1951 was \$901,940,000 compared with \$872,680,000 for 1950. Sales in December rose to \$119,770,000 from \$118,870,000, a jump of 0.8 per cent.
