Referendum May Decide Strife-Torn Cyprus Future

NICOSIA (CP)—"If I spit up words and spit on the floor, it's downwards, on my beard."
As Cyprus heads into a new year, an acute phase of the island's problems seems to have passed.

There hasn't been any serious fighting between Greek and Turk since August and, in relative terms, normal conditions prevail.
Olives, carobs, lemons and grapes are harvested in respective seasons which greet the new year.

CONCERN FELT AROUND ISLAND
Outside the island fringes from many lands a broad sympathy for the Cyprus plea. Greece has voted in the country's 80 per cent Greek population.

EXPECT REFERENDUM
But eventually there should be a referendum offering alternative solutions. Independence for the island: complete union with Greece; or partial union with Greece.
