It is a wonder to me that the directors of the S.N. Co. would take the risk, when it is not at all necessary. Then I wonder that the Insurance Co. allows it.

Then what about the arrangement so far as mails are concerned, is it an advantage? It may be. But very small. And what about the passenger traffic? I want to go to Halifax, and start Saturday and arrive in Halifax Monday night. That's nice. Coming this way, the passenger leaves Halifax in the morning and gets to Charlottetown next forenoon and no place to sleep over night. If the Board of Trade is responsible for these arrangements, I say the Board ought to be ashamed of itself.

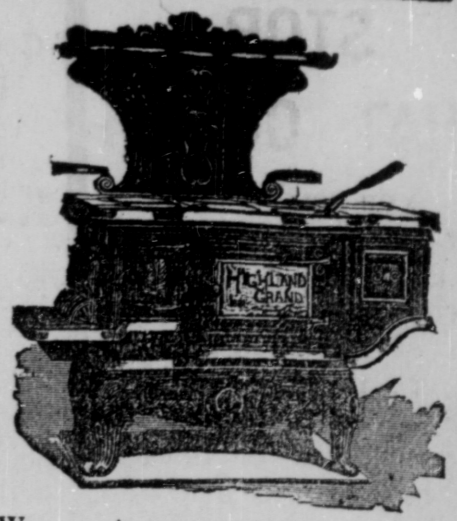
