REDS MAKE PROPOSAL To End Bomb Tests

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy said Wednesday the United States agrees with the Soviet proposal for a Jan. 1, 1963, deadline for a halt in nuclear testing. But he said the United States will not enter into an agreement with provisions Responding to the Soviet suggestion made at the Geneva disarmament conference for an accord to end testing by next New Year's Day, Khrushchev called for intensive and serious negotiations to reach a "workable international agreement" by that date.

Skyshield Will Ground Civilian Aircraft Sunday

OTTAWA (CP) — The military will have exclusive use of North American skies for 5 1/2 hours Sunday for air defence exercises Sky Shield III in all civilian flights in Canada and the United States. There are some 200,000 a day, including 600 from overseas—will be grounded between 3 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. EDT to permit North American Air Defence Command to test its ability to track back any bomber assault on the continent.
