

Moncton Beats Halifax Club

MONCTON (CP)—A five-goal spree by Oscar Gaudet helped Moncton Hawks outlast Halifax Club Hockey League 2 to 1 in a game played before 461 fans here Saturday.

Gaudet's four goals in the opening period powered the Hawks to a 5-1 first period lead that was 7-4 at the end of the second frame.

Doug McPhee shot two goals and R. O. Laramonde one to rout out the Hawks' scoring line.

McLaramonde and Bill Huson had two each for Tarentino Graver and Keith Beckman shot singles.

Hawks outshot the Halifax club 35-8 in the contest and the win put Moncton into third place, leaving Tarentino in last place in the four-team league.

Gaudet's five goals and two assists gave him 90 scoring points for the season so far, six behind leader Jacques Allard of the league leading Windsor Maple Leafs.

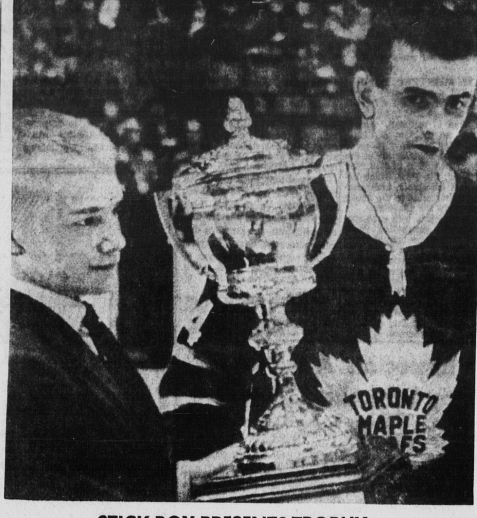

TORONTO (CP)—It takes a lot more than a shutout to make professional hockey's oldest goaltender, 39-year-old Johnny Bower of Toronto Maple Leafs, excited.

"Sure, it's nice to get a shutout," said Bower following Saturday night's 2-0 National Hockey League victory over Detroit Red Wings here. It was Bower's initial shutout of the season, his 19th overall in the league and 71st in professional hockey. He had recorded 52 in American League action dating back to the 1945-46 season.

"Other than that, we played on even terms with the Leafs. Crozier (Detroit goalie) played another fine game for us. But we just couldn't put the puck into the net. That's been our trouble all year. We can't finish off plays. But one of these days we'll break through."

Crozier was playing in his sixth game as a Red Wing and it was his first defeat.

"It's tough to make a close game like that. But I don't think either of the goals was my fault. A big thing playing for Abel is there is no pressure. He has told me he is going to keep playing me even if I have the odd bad game. That's sure encouraging for a rookie like me. I would never have had that kind of a chance at Chicago."
