delivered in Montreal was un-

in wholesale jobbing lots made 22.
Ontario white cheese was quoted
at 12 1/8-8 and colored at 12 1/8-8.
Graded egg shipments in used
free cases were offered at 24 cen-
ts a dozen for A-large, 22 for A-
medium, 17 for B-large, 14-14 1/2
for C.

MONTREAL, July 12 —(CP)—
Receipts on the Montreal livestock
market today were: 24 cattle, 25
lambs, 200 hogs and 64 calves.
All prices were unchanged. Calves
ranged from \$3.75 for grassers to
\$7 for veals. There were no top
calves. Drinkers and fair to medium
veal sold in mixed lots at \$5
to \$6.
Lambs sold up to \$9.50 with a
cut of \$1 per cwt. On bucks and
\$2 on culls.
Hogs were steady at \$9.75 for
bacons fed and watered and up to
\$9.90 off trucks. Selects drew \$1
per hog premium with the regular
culls on off grades. Cows were
sold up to \$6. Rail grade hogs sold
for \$13.25 to \$13.35 cold weight.
Rail grade hogs declined 20 cents
to \$12.30 warm weight and live
grade declined 15 cents to \$9.15
sows were unchanged at \$6.65
dressed weight and \$5.15 off
trucks.
Cattle were down from 25 to 50
cents per cwt. best cattle tak-
ing the heaviest losses. Choice
steers made \$6.25, good \$5.75,
medium \$5.25, fair \$4.25 and com-
mon \$4. Choice heifers brought \$6
good \$5.50, medium were unchang-
ed at \$5, fair quality brought \$4
and common \$3.75. Top cows
brought \$4.50. Good \$4, medium
\$3.50, fair \$3.25, and canners and
cutters \$1.50 to \$2.75. Boning up
sold for \$3 to \$3.25 and butcher
bulls \$3.25 to \$4.
Grass calves sold for \$2.50 to \$3
and veals from \$3 to \$4.50.

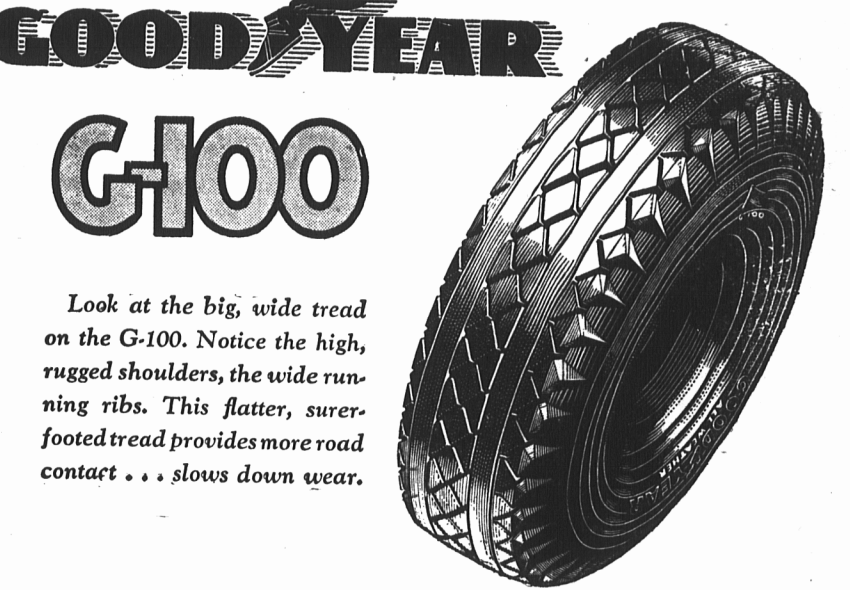

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, July 12 —(CP)—
New six-year low levels were es-
tablished by wheat futures prices
on Winnipeg grain exchange to-
day as outside markets again pro-
moted a wave of outside selling.
July, all futures sank to new
lows and closed 3-8-1 1-8 cent low-
er, July at 54 3-8, Oct. 54 1-4a,
Nov. 54a and Dec. 55 7-8b.
Sea board houses and mills of-
fered fair support on the decline.
Export sales of Canadian wheat
were expected to reach 400,000
bushels.
Lack of demand for actual wheat
and presence of moderate selling
pressure forced Liverpool values
7-6d down. Buenos Aires remained
unchanged.
Export interests made minor
purchases of Nos. 1, 2 and 3
Northern in the cash wheat mar-
ket. Liquidation in sympathy with
the weaker trend in which carried
coarse grain prices slightly low-
er.
CHICAGO, July 12 —(AP)—
Wheat prices influenced by a
sharp sell-off in the corn market,
weakened in late trade today and
September and December contracts
fell to new season lows.
Wheat for September delivery
declined to 65 3/4 cents, down 1-
1/4 from the previous close. De-
cember contracts fell to 67, down 1
1/2, and July to 64 7/8, down 1
1/4. Prices recovered partially in
closing minutes.
All corn contracts fell to new
season lows. December corn, rep-
resenting the new crop, dropped 2
1/8 cents below the previous close
to 49 7/8. July also was up two
cents and September 1 3/4 cents
at the extreme.
Wheat closed 1-2-1 1-8 lower.
July 65 1-4-3-8, Sept. 66 1-4-3-8;
corn 1 1-4-1 7-8 lower, July 44
3-4-7-8, September 45 7-8-46; oats
1-4-1-2 lower.

NATIONAL FORESTRY PROGRAM

Under an Agreement between the Federal Department of Labor and the Government of the Province of Prince Edward Island arrangements have been made to initiate a Forestry Program in this province involving the establishing of between 20 and 30 wood and timber lot improvement areas.
These areas will be properly cleaned and improved under the direction of qualified group leaders operating on instructions of officials representing the National Forestry Service and the Department of Agriculture. A total of about fifty-four (54) young men between the age of 18 and 25 inclusive are required to conduct this service. An excellent training in woodlot improvement will be secured by the enrollees.
Students making application should be in unemployed circumstances, in good health, possess good character and a fair education. Transportation, tuition, living costs and a reasonable per day allowance will be made. Selections for the work will be made strictly according to the provisions of the Policy by a special Committee appointed for this purpose.
