## Critic Of High Naval Brass May Be Called By Committee

 OTTAWA (CP) — The Commons defence committee is expected to resume hearings next week, probably Tuesday, and one of the first witnesses may be retired navy Commodore James Plomer.  
 The 58-year-old former deputy naval controller who resigned last spring charged Sept. 7 in a Maclean's magazine article that a "self-selecting" group of admirals is running the RCN like a private club and that ships of the fleet are "badly chosen, badly equipped and poorly manned."  
 Liberal MP Maurice Sauve, committee chairman, said Monday in an interview that some committee members have proposed that Commodore Plomer be asked to testify and that the matter will be dealt with this week by the steering committee.  
 Commodore Plomer has already said he is willing to appear before the committee. Defence Minister Hellyer ordered a complete investigation of Commodore Plomer's charges immediately after they appeared but both the defence department and the navy has declined comment of any sort on the case.

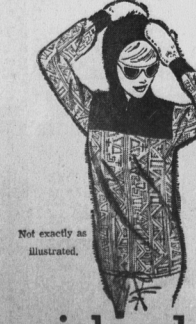
