**CALL FOR APPLICATIONS** FOR TOURIST CABIN CONCESSION  
**FUNDY NATIONAL PARK**  
Sealed tenders addressed to the Superintendent, Fundy National Park, Alma, New Brunswick, will be received up to noon on Monday, February 3rd, 1959, for the privilege of operating as a concession the tourist cabin development recently constructed on Hastings Hill in Fundy National Park. Tenders should be offered on the basis of the annual rental the applicant is prepared to pay for the concession, calculated on a percentage of the gross receipts from the rental of the cabins.

In submitting a tender the envelope enclosing same should be endorsed "Tender for Tourist Cabin Concession". Each tender must be accompanied by a deposit of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00), in the form of an accepted cheque, a money order, or draft made payable to the Receiver General of Canada. Any tender in the amount of less than fifteen per cent (15%) of gross receipts will not be considered, and the highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

The concession consists of twenty-four tourist cabins, eighteen of which have kitchenettes equipped with propane gas cooking facilities and refrigerators. Bathrooms are provided in all twenty-four units, equipped with a gas water heater. Cabins are also equipped with gas space heaters and electric lighting. If required, an office building for the use of the concessionaire will be provided by the Department. The successful applicant will be required to furnish the cabins to the satisfaction of the Park Superintendent. Applicants are also invited to tender on an adjacent 20 unit motel development. In the event that any person wishes to submit tenders for both developments a separate tender will be required for each concession.

Particulars concerning the buildings to be made available, the conditions to be complied with, the terms of lease to be entered into, and the basis on which the concession will be awarded may be obtained from the Superintendent of Fundy National Park.

No tender will be considered unless accompanied by all the information stipulated in the conditions under which the concession will be awarded.
