MAKE THE MEN MARKET.

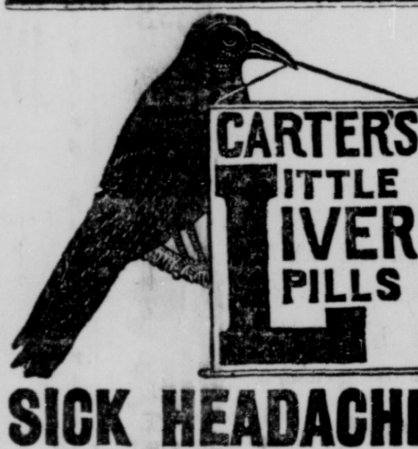
A Woman Writer's Bold Suggestion to Help Weary Wives.

There are few things that exhaust a woman more than a day's shopping. The average man looks upon a woman's "purchasing day" as one of pleasure, but when he accompanies her on one of these shopping expeditions he goes home, after his patience has been all exhausted, with a different belief. He learns, too, that a woman can endure vexations and disappointments with much more equanimity than he can, and he mentally vows never to do it again.

The number of miles traversed is really what tires one, and it is little wonder that the woman who does the shopping for herself and her entire family, as well as the marketing and the bargaining with the "butcher and baker and candlestick maker," should feel the need of rest for her tired nerves.

The man of the house should always do the marketing. In the old days, when the butler was not the stately personage he is now, women were never troubled with the worries of household purchasing, for the head of the house did the entire buying, and "James" carried the parcels and was not ashamed to do it.

No mother who has the care of little children should give the precious morning hours to anything else but the nursery, nor should she let butchers' and grocers' boys call for and deliver orders, because there is sure to be dissatisfaction if she does. Some wealthy families allow their chef to take charge of the household, and he collects a large percentage from the tradesmen, which, of course, is added to the monthly bill. Reputable storekeepers will not do this kind of business, however, and the chef "patronage" is controlled entirely by a few men. On the whole, it is much more satisfactory for the man of the house to do the marketing. He will get the best meat, have his orders promptly attended to and save about 25 per cent in the transaction, as well as the health of his wife.—Chicago Times-Herald.

HOW TO GET TO CHARLOTTETOWN

The steamer Halifax leaves Boston for Charlottetown every Saturday at noon and will be due at Charlottetown on Monday night. On the following Tuesday at one she will leave on return to Boston. Halifax and Port Hawkesbury are called at every trip. Passengers may take the steamer at any of the ports mentioned. The Halifax has been supplemented by the Grand Duchess.

The steamer City of Ghent plys between Halifax and Charlottetown each week, calling at several ports en route. She is due here every Thursday.

The steamers Coban, Bonavista, Campana, Tiber and Polino, of Montreal, also make Charlottetown a port of call.

Passengers for this Province coming by way of Picton are brought to Charlottetown by the steamer Princess. Those coming by way of Point Du Chene connect with the steamer Northumberland, and may come through to Charlottetown by the mail special which leaves Summerside each evening immediately after the steamer reaches that port.

An Italian Pension.

The Poletti's little cottage stands in a field and is semidetached. Like many of their class in Italy, they have a great love for and pride in their home. The furniture is well polished, the tools and utensils arranged with an attempt at decoration, and all is clean and neat. It is a two roomed house. On the ground floor is the kitchen, where the boy's bed stands under the stair which leads to the upper room. Here are two large beds, one for the parents, the other for the two girls.

In the kitchen stand a walnut wood table and a sideboard of antique design, an heirloom of the mother's; a walnut chest holds the bed and table linen and another old chest the best clothes; the everyday clothes are kept in a chest up stairs. They try to add something every year to the house linen. Sometimes the mother and daughters beg the use of a little plot of ground, which they sow with flax, and the year following they spin and weave it themselves, borrowing a loom from a farmer. Their stock compares favorably with that of the better off English cottager, to say nothing of the quality of this homemade linen compared to that bought cheap at a country shop.—Fortnightly Review.

Titles For Sale.

The only state in which the sale of nobiliary honors is open and legal is, strangely enough, a republic—the tiny Italian republic of San Marino, of the existence of which many are unaware. You can get a title in San Marino on application—and payment of the fee, which is not always the same for the individual honor—and the proceeds are used for the support of the national founding asylum. San Marino distinctions do not count for anything outside the state and for but little within it.
