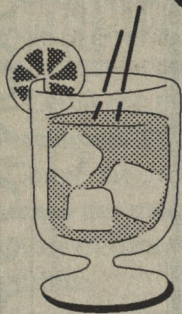

Difficulty with the language, inability to get work in their own field, and a lack of "connection" to the community are all major factors in the isolation and loneliness that many new Canadians feel.

The "New Friends" host Program is run by the Cross Cultural Information Committee and funded by Immigration Canada. It is a volunteer program that matches newcomers to Canada with island residents for the purpose of emotional support and friendship.
