## Senior Commonwealth Officials Open Preliminary Trade Talks

LONDON (CP)—Senior officials from the Commonwealth's 22 member countries opened a week-long confidential session Monday to prepare the way for a full Commonwealth trade conference in 1966. The conference likely will be held here next spring.

While most of the week will be devoted to discussing new ideas for enhancing Commonwealth trade, including the tricky job of increasing support for sterling, part of the meeting will be taken up with the Rhodesian crisis and the impact of Rhodesian sanctions on neighboring Zambia.

Zambian President Kenneth Kaunda, who has called on Britain to supply troops to protect the border, also has appealed to Arnold Smith of Canada, Commonwealth secretary-general, to raise Zambia's need for economic assistance before the current trade session.

Trade officials have agreed to deal with Kaunda's plea as a matter of urgency, to explore ways in which the Commonwealth can help alleviate Zambia's suffering that may result from loss of trade with Rhodesia, an informant said.

FACE MANY PROBLEMS  
In the broader search for ways of expanding Commonwealth trade, the officials who are mainly deputy ministers and similar rank are confronted with

a maze of problems. One of the biggest is how to get the industrialized countries, such as Canada and Britain, to take more manufactured goods from the developing countries, such as those in Africa and Asia.

Tariff preferences are of little use, the developing countries say, when certain low-priced and competitive imports are curbed by the industrialized countries through quotas, embargoes and other means.

From the British side comes the view that unless more international credit is provided, hopes of expanding trade inside and outside the Commonwealth will be dashed by unwanted recession.

This view is held particularly by the Commonwealth Industries Association which believes both Canada and the United States should hold more sterling as part of their permanent official monetary reserves—in effect, using their economies to back up sterling's international strength.

LACK CREDIT  
Association Director Edward Holloway said in an interview that since the U.S. and Britain are attempting to reduce their foreign trade deficits, thereby curbing the flow of their currencies abroad, the world may face recession because of a lack of international credit or "liquidity" as the experts call it.

The association notes in a statement to the trade officials that to some extent there already exists an arrangement whereby the central banks of Canada, United States and Britain swap their currencies for a fixed period. Under the association's proposal, the sterling Canada and the U.S. would get from swaps would remain in their reserves "indefinitely," a suggestion unlikely to find much favor with Canadian monetary managers.

### West Berliners Seeking Passes

BERLIN (Reuters) — Thousands of West Berliners lined up Monday for passes to make Christmas and New Year visits to relatives on the other side of the Communist wall dividing East and West Berlin.

Sixteen offices, staffed by East German and West Berlin postmen, reopened under an agreement reached last week after five months of tough bargaining.

About 600,000 West Berliners were expected to take day-passes for two between Dec. 16 and Jan. 2. A 17th office is issuing special passes for pressing family reasons, mainly births, funerals and weddings.

The new passes agreement is the third since the Wall was built in 1961.

## Mrs. Fulton Sanderson Funeral Service Today

The funeral of the late Mrs. Fulton Sanderson, York Point, will be held this afternoon. Mrs. Sanderson, 53, died Sunday in the Prince Edward Island Hospital after a comparatively brief illness.

Helen, as she was known to a large number of friends in this province, and in the sister Maritime Provinces as well, was a daughter of the late William Ernest MacKinley, North River, and his wife, who was the former Irene Dixon.

After attending Prince of Wales College, she taught for several years in Warren Grove School.

## Rhodesian Regime Seizes Government House Property

SALISBURY (Reuters) — The Rhodesian regime confiscated Monday more property from Government House, the official residence of the former colony's governor, Sir Humphrey Gibbs.

Under police supervision, office furniture including desks and typewriters was moved from Government House to Government Lodge three miles away.

The lodge has been established as the official residence of Clifford Dupont, appointed last week as acting officer administering the Rhodesian government.
