



ISLAND BEAUTY SPOT TO BE SCENE OF ROYAL LUNCHEON

Royal Visit Program In Detail

The detailed program for the Royal visit to Prince Edward Island next Thursday and Friday, by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and His Royal Highness Prince Philip, has been announced as follows, with all times listed being Atlantic Standard.

10:00 a.m.—The Royal barge arrives at the Railway Wharf—Her Majesty and His Royal Highness disembark and are met by His Honor F.W. Hyndman and Mrs. Hyndman, Premier A.W. Matheson and Mrs. Matheson, His Worship Mayor E.C. Johnstone and Mrs. Johnstone, and Hon. Angus MacLean, minister of fisheries, and Mrs. MacLean—Her Majesty is escorted by the Lt. Governor to the dais and is accorded Royal Salute by Guard of Honour from the RCAF Station Summerside, under command of Flight Lieutenant D. F. McGrath, DFC of White Rock, B.C.

10:05 a.m.—Her Majesty inspects the Guard of Honour—the Lt. Governor and Mrs. Hyndman take leave of Her Majesty.

10:10 a.m.—The Royal Party enters automobiles and drive to HMCS Queen Charlotte via Prince and Water Streets.

10:15 a.m.—Arrive at HMCS Queen Charlotte where Premier Matheson will present to Her Majesty senior naval officers and the officer commanding HMCS Queen Charlotte—Premier Matheson will deliver an address of welcome and Her Majesty will reply. Commander J.N. Kenny will then conduct the Royal party inside the building where Premier Matheson will present members of the legislature and their wives, members of the City Council and their wives, and senior active service officers of the province and their wives.

10:35 a.m.—The Royal party enters automobiles and proceeds to Frozen Food Plant at Sherwood via Rochford, Grafton, Weymouth Streets, Longworth Avenue, St. Peters Road, Brackley Point Road and Sherwood Road. Distance—4.4 miles.

11:00 a.m.—Arrive at Frozen Food Plant, Sherwood—met by Hon. Eugene Cullen, minister of agriculture, and Mrs. Cullen, Mr. W.H. Heaney, president of the Prince Edward Island Frozen Foods Limited and Mrs. Heaney, Leslie Palmer, vice-president, and Mrs. Palmer, R.J. Hetherington, plant manager and Mrs. Hetherington, and George Wright, assistant plant manager, and Mrs. Wright.

11:25 a.m.—Leave Frozen Food Plant and drive to farm of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Prowse, Brackley. Distance—3.8 miles. (Fast Drive).

11:35 a.m.—Arrive at farm of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Prowse, Brackley—met by Mr. and Mrs. Prowse and Lt. Col. Ernest Johnstone, president of Prince Edward Island Rural Beautification Society, and Mrs. Johnstone.

12:00 noon—Re-enter automobiles and drive to summer residence of Mrs. George DeBlois (fast drive) via Brackley Beach, Stanhope Camp and picnic grounds (13.2 miles from the Prowse Farm). During this drive Her Majesty will see typical island beaches and hundreds of people enjoying seaside holidays on the beach, on the picnic grounds and in tents, trailers, etc., and also have an opportunity to see the fine type of facilities our National Parks provide for the recreation of summer vacationists. (Slow drive where people gathered on route) Distance Prowse farm to DeBlois Residence 15.7 miles.

12:40 p.m.—Royal Party arrives.

1:00 p.m.—Informal luncheon by Lt. Governor.

2:00 p.m.—Leave for Charlottetown by way of Bedford, St. Peters Road, and Hawthorne Avenue. Distance—15.7 miles.

2:40 p.m.—Arrive at Colosseum for presentation by children. Premier Matheson will present youth leaders to Her Majesty and Her Majesty will be asked to accept a bouquet presented by Velda Paynter of Long River, representing children of the province who have suffered from polio. Her Majesty will present three gold cords to Girl Guides and three Queen Scout badges to Boy Scouts.

2:50 p.m.—Re-enter automobiles and drive to adjacent race track grounds—met by president of Provincial Exhibition Association, Cecil Stewart and Mrs. Stewart, the secretary, Commander G.H. Buntain and Mrs. Buntain, and the general manager, H.J. Kennedy and Mrs. Kennedy.

3:15 p.m.—Re-enter automobiles and drive to Government House (slow drive) by way of Hawthorne Avenue, St. Peters Road, Longworth Avenue, Euston Street, Ambrose Street, McGill Avenue, North River Road, Brighton Road, P.E.I. Hospital Driveway, Government Pond Roadway. Distance—3 miles.

4:00 P.M.—Arrive at Government House (Guests already assembled for Afternoon Tea on Lawn). County and Probate Court judges and their wives and Federal members of Parliament for Queens and Prince County and their wives will be presented.

4:30 p.m.—Her Majesty mingles with guests on Government House Lawn.

5:30 p.m.—Her Majesty leaves and Afternoon Tea concludes.

7:30 p.m.—Private Dinner at Government House. (Formal).

10:15 p.m.—Fireworks display at Fort Edward.

FRIDAY, JULY 31

9:00 a.m.—Royal Party enters automobiles and leaves Government House for Charlottetown Airport via Kent, Great George, Euston Streets, Longworth Avenue, St. Peters Road, Brackley Point Road.

9:25 a.m.—Arrive Charlottetown Airport where Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will be bade "bon voyage" by the Lt. Governor and Mrs. Hyndman, Premier Matheson and Mrs. Matheson, Mayor Johnstone and Mrs. Johnstone, Hon. Angus MacLean and Mrs. MacLean, and local heads of the armed forces.

9:30 a.m.—Royal Aircraft takes off for New Glasgow, Nova Scotia.

AMID NORTH SHORE BEAUTIES

Setting Is Superb For Royal Luncheon

The picturesque North Shore with its miles of beautiful bathing beaches will be the setting for a noon luncheon for Her Majesty the Queen and Prince Philip. The Lieutenant Governor and Mrs. Hyndman will be hosts to the Royal visitors at the summer home of Mrs. George D. DeBlois.

It is interesting to recall that Mrs. DeBlois and her late husband, the Hon. George D. DeBlois, a former lieutenant governor, were hosts in June of 1939 to the Queen Mother and the late King George VI.

BUILT AROUND 1897
The DeBlois summer home is believed to have been originally built around 1897 by a Col. Orr of Cincinnati, U.S., a friend of the MacDonalds' who were the original owners of Dalvay house. As a guest at Dalvay, he was so impressed with the scenic beauty, bathing facilities and fishing he decided on a summer residence here.

Later the home passed into the hands of Brown Bros. from York, who had moved to the West and met with considerable success but still longed to maintain their Island ties.

ONCE OWNED BOTH
The late Hon. G.D. DeBlois, who at one time also owned Dalvay house, purchased the property

from the Browns and it has remained in the DeBlois family since. The impressive and attractive Dalvay house, now a summer home, was built in 1895 by the late Edward Island National Park Alexander MacDonald, a vice-president of the Standard Oil Company, as a summer residence and his palatial home in Cincinnati, Ohio.
