

Anchors Pound Out 11-4 Victory Over Falcons In City League Game

Charlie Ryan's West-end Anchors showed eight runs across the plate in the second inning on a combination of lusty hitting and Jackadical play afield and went on to drub the northwest Falcons 11-4 in a City Baseball League game yesterday afternoon.

Anchors pounded out eight hits in the second inning, two of them doubles as twelve batters came to the plate. They added three more runs in the sixth inning.

Centre fielder Glen Matheson led the Anchor barrage as he pounded out five hits in five trips to the plate for a perfect day at bat. His last hit was a booming triple to deep centre field.

Left hander Jackie Burke went all the way for the winners limiting the Falcons to only four hits. Burke pitched steady as he walked only one man and struck out six.

Playing coach Buck Whitlock was the star of the Falcons. He took over the pitching duties in the second innings to kill the Anchor rally. Buck struck out ten men, walked one and gave up seven hits.

Buck also provided the Falcons punch at the plate. He banged out three hits in four tries to drive in two runs. His first hit was a double into centre field.

The Falcons picked up single runs in the first and fourth innings and scored two in the sixth. They threatened to get back into the ball game in the sixth but a heads up double play by the Anchors eliminated the threat.

The bases were loaded in the sixth as the result of singles by Whitlock and Joe Coyle and an intentional pass to Cliff Ready. Burke forced Kenny MacDonald to hit back to the mound, threw to Flynn at the plate to force Whitlock and Flynn relayed to first to put out MacDonald and retire the side.

Elmer McNeill and Des Trainor socked out doubles in the Anchors big second inning. Matheson had two singles, Hennessey, McKenzie, Flynn and Pineau one each. Three errors by the Falcons aided matters.

Falcons played without the services of Joe LeClair and Vernon Larter. Brian Lewis played third, Joe Coyle behind the bat and Jimmy Allen in right field. Every Anchor got at least one hit and all scored a run except the pitcher.

Cliff Ready started for the Falcons and although hit hard was

not given too much support. The win shows the Anchors into a second place tie with the Falcons.

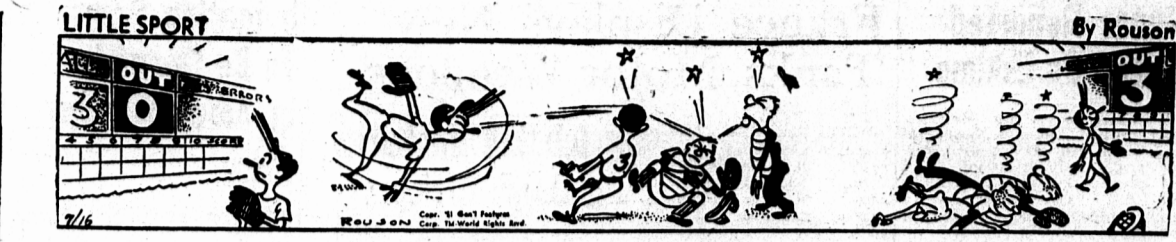

Both senior and junior tennis enthusiasts will have a chance to test their mettle in tournament play here this week when the first scheduled competitions for local racquet wielders this season will be run off in each division. The tournaments will be held over the Charlottetown Tennis Club courts.

The Charlottetown junior championships will be first on the program when a 12-man entry list will commence first round play this morning commencing at ten o'clock and will be continued on this afternoon and tomorrow when finalists are expected to be declared. The tourney will be held in two district groups, one for those 18-years and under and one for those 15-years and under, with each division declaring a champion. Competitions will be in singles events only.

The junior tourney will be held under the sanction of the Canadian Lawn Tennis Association, the winners continuing on into Provincial play later this summer which will also be under C. L. T. A. sponsorship, the Island titleists being sent on to compete in Dominion championship play at Ottawa in August. The City championships were scheduled to get underway on Thursday but had to be postponed because of rain.

Highlighting the tennis later in the week will be the Provincial Closed senior championships which will open its first round matches on Wednesday afternoon at the Charlottetown Club. A large entry list is expected from City clubs as well as the R. C. F. Station at Summerside and some of the keenest competition in recent years is anticipated in Provincial play for the first time last season, a strong team from the Summerside airport gave the best players from the City a tight run for leading honors, many advancing into third-round and semifinal play before being eliminated. Their participation added the extra spark in local competition that has been lacking during the past two or three years and their team entry is being looked forward to with much interest by local enthusiasts again this year.

Titles will be contested in five divisions during the course of the tournament including men's and ladies' singles, men's and ladies' doubles and mixed doubles. Although the opening date for entry was only last Saturday, entries are coming in fast for all divisions giving promising indication of a particularly large field this year. Over 16 entries for men's singles competition have been received from the Charlottetown Club alone with good representation in the other events also being received from the local club. All entries will close at six o'clock Tuesday evening.

Cheeky Chief Wins Free For All But Vella La Vella Takes Last Dash

A pacing black mare with a big fighting heard called Vella La Vella came from behind to win the third dash of the free for all pace from the great Cheeky Chief as the climax to an exciting night's racing at the Provincial Exhibition track Saturday night.

The fast pacing Cheeky Chief won the first and second heats of the race with little trouble. Driver Joey Hennessey had the Chief in front all the way in both races and came to the wire about two lengths ahead.

Most of the night's excitement was found in the 2:14 pace. Argot Pointer, reined by Harold Stead took the first dash. Claude O'Brien drove Loch Hanover to a win the second dash and Hedge-wood Chief came through in the stretch to win the third.

Joan Chief, a pacing roan mare, won the second and fifth races. The sleek pacer set a new record in the second race by doing the mile in 2:12 2-5. Miss Judy Dale won the opening dash for trotters.

But it was the former Island horse, Vella La Vella that captured the hearts of the 2500 fans at the track. Given little chance to beat the Chief, Vella did the mile in 2:08 2-5 to win by half a length in the final dash.

Cheeky Chief was down to the half in 1:02 4-5. Driven by MacDonald made his move with Vella at the half and pursued the Chief up the back stretch.

Vella caught Cheeky Chief in the stretch and outlasted the big stallion to come to the wire in front. The win was greeted with the roar of the crowd.

Argot Pointer came thundering down the stretch to pass the Loch Hedgewood Chief and win the first dash of the 2:14 pace. Loch Hanover beat out Col. Looker in the second dash and Hedgewood Chief came up on the outside with a great burst to take the third dash in thrilling fashion.

The daily double on Joan Chief and Argot Pointer paid \$140. One of the winners was Frank Strain, sub-goalie of the Islanders hockey team. A. Hughes, 27 York Lane won the \$125 sweepstake by picking the five winners.
