

Hopes to Cure Cancer.

AN AUSTRIAN DOCTOR FOLLOWING UP KOCH'S EXPERIMENTS.

Prof. Billaeth, of Vienna, entertains strong hopes of being able to perform effectual cures in cases of cancer. The Professor has made this malady his special study for years, and his operations are widely known in the medical profession. He is now convinced, from recent experience, that cancer is caused by infection and that it is bacillie in its nature.

The New York Herald's Berlin cable says: Dr. Koch is certain his remedy will cure consumption as he has said, but there can be no truth in what is asserted about its being a cure for cancer, as in that case Koch's idea of its being a specific remedy and differential diagnostic would be exploded. Prof. Frantzel as well as other doctors agree in attributing to Prof. Koch's remedy of the greatest value for diagnostic purposes, and in cases of tubercular diseases of the skin. As to the lung and internal organs its effect remains doubtful. Prof. Koch has repeatedly declared that he has not yet completed his investigations and it is to be hoped continued experiments will be crowned with still greater success. The municipal authorities have allotted temporarily to Prof. Koch five buildings in the Moabit suburb of Berlin for the purpose of aiding him in carrying on his experiments looking to the discovery of a cure for infectious diseases such as scarlet fever, measles, diphtheria and typhus fever. Prof. Koch will also carry on his investigations into the nature and cure of cancer in these buildings. There will be accommodation for 150 patients in the temporary hospital. The professor considers that his labors in connection with tuberculosis are finished. The Emperor is very anxious to have Dr. Koch's remedy applied in the German Army, where consumption is more deadly than any other disease.

Three patients treated by the Koch method are reported dead. They were all in a critical condition before they received the injection.

Physicians are agreed that Dr. Koch's tuberculosis remedy proves effective only in the treatment of mild cases of the disease.

Origin of an Old Ballad.

The name of Lord Ellenborough, whose death was announced a little while ago, was in his youth associated with that of Queen, then Princess, Victoria. It was a matter of common rumor that the young people were devoted to each other, and that the youthful Queen insisted that she should choose him as her consort, says the Philadelphia Record. But reasons of state prevailed over love, and young Ellenborough was given a commission in the army and went to India, where he distinguished himself.
