Sincere, Genuine Interest Called Top Asset For Nurse

T. Ledwell Doyle of Moncton, executive director of Maritime Services Association, gave the main address last night at graduation exercises of the Charlottetown Hospital School of Nursing and X-ray Technology. The ceremony, held at the Basilica Recreation Centre, saw 26 nurses and two x-ray technicians receive graduating diplomas.

Mr. Doyle told the graduates a good nurse is one with a background of sound training, a sense of good judgment, a willingness to give and a dedication to the human dimension in nursing.

"You must recognize the need to further your education — and with your basic training you have the ability to do that — whether it be formal or on the job," training, he said, adding that there was a serious shortage of instructors, supervisors and administrators in the nursing field.

"As your knowledge increases, you will be able to accept new and varied assignments, thus broadening your experience. It is then that you begin to acquire sound judgment," Mr. Doyle said.

NEED TO GIVE

He said a nurse must also be willing to give. "The person in search of a satisfying life does not ask for comfort, but for an opportunity to exercise his abilities."

The speaker said a nurse may be technically proficient and possess high academic standing, but "without a sincere and genuine interest in your patient — you will be a failure as a nurse."

Mr. Doyle was introduced and thanked by Dr. J.H. Maloney, chairman of the event.

Valedictorian was Delphine Arsenault of Summerside. Diplomas were presented to the graduates by Most Rev. Malcolm A. MacEachern, Bishop of Charlottetown and pins were presented by Sister Mary Monica, MS, director of nursing education at the hospital, and Stella Driscoll, RN, nursing arts instructor.
