U Nu Resigns As Premier Of Burma

RANGOON, Burma (Reuters)—Premier U Nu Tuesday turned his post over to defence minister U Ba Swe for a one-year period in order to devote his full energies to reorganizing his political party.

U Nu, who has served as premier ever since this country gained its independence from Britain eight years ago, said he regards the new premier "as my own younger brother."

U Ba Swe, 41, told reporters there would be no change in Burma's independent foreign policy. He said, however, his government would seek a two-year period of military conscription and bring about the progressive reduction of irregular armies in the provinces.

U Ba Swe described the shift as "only a change of personalities." Like his predecessor, he said he would abide by the decisions of the ruling party—the anti-Fascist People's Freedom League.

BACK IN ONE YEAR

The party's executive committee approved a resolution declaring U Nu would continue as League president and would be permitted to resign as premier for 12 months to enable him to reorganize the League. It said that after one year U Nu would resume the premiership.

At Tuesday morning's session of the League, U Nu said "there is nothing strange in my decision to step out" for reorganization work. The League lost ground to pro-Communist opponents in national elections in April.

U Nu, 49, a devout Buddhist, said he had asked several times to be relieved of his responsibilities as premier but his party colleagues would not accept his views.

Expect 250 To Nominate In Quebec Election

QUEBEC (CP)—Approximately 250 candidates, at least six of them women, are expected to be nominated today to contest the June 20 provincial election.

The number of candidates filing nomination papers with returning officers before the 3 p.m. A.D.T. deadline is expected to be slightly higher than in the general election of 1952 but will be well below the record of 333 in 1944. In the 1952 election 241 candidates were nominated and five later withdrew.

As nomination day neared, 247 candidates were listed in the province's 93 constituencies. Some last-minute entries were expected.

The Union Nationale party, in office since 1944, nominated 122 candidates in all 93 constituencies. The Liberals nominated 91 candidates and backed independent candidates in two other constituencies. Among the 91 were four adherents of L'Union des Electeurs Quebecais of the Social Credit party.
