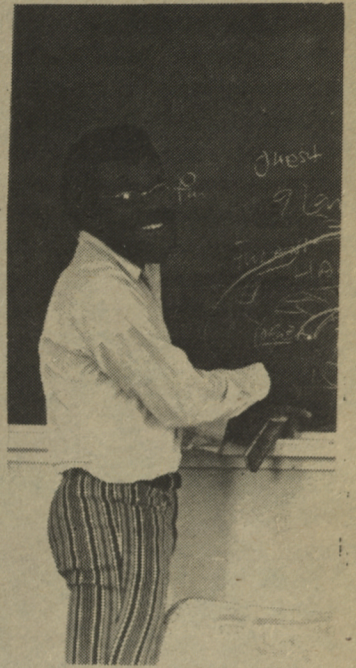
make it impossible to get other films for U.P.E.I. from the film library.
