## FIELDING AND THE TARIFF.

No Important Changes at the Next Session.

What Mr. Fielding Says About Preference to Great Britain.

LONDON, Oct. 9.—Hon. Mr. Fielding makes an important disclosure of the Canadian policy. He says that though the present tariff falls short of his free trade intentions and ideas that tariff tinkering is most harassing to trade. Hence no material change will be made next session. Asked after the expiration of the Belgian-German treaties in August next a preference would be given to Great Britain alone, Mr. Fielding said: "We entered on our policy with the desire to give a preference to British goods alone and it is not likely that we will depart from it."

## Sudden Death at Halifax.

HALIFAX, Oct. 9.—Michael Kelly dropped dead yesterday. He was a messenger in the employ of the Imperial Government and was stationed at the Ordnance. After 4 o'clock he was sent with a message to the residence of Lieut. Smith, and while there he became ill and expired immediately. Medical aid was summoned but when it arrived the last spark of life had fled.

## The Washington Convention.

OTTAWA, Oct. 9.—The Department of Marine and Fisheries was in communication all day yesterday with Sir Louie Davies who is on P. E. Island waiting the arrival of the Earl of Aberdeen who reaches there on the 15th inst., over the coming convention at Washington in regard to seal life in Behring Sea.

## LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

OTTAWA, Oct. 7.—The destruction caused by the fire in Russell and Prescott counties is far worse than anticipated. The fire swept over 30 square miles of territory. Five lives were lost, 2,000 people rendered homeless and the damage amounts to hundreds of thousands of dollars. The Ottawa city council has voted one thousand dollars for temporary relief.

LONDON, Oct. 6.—It is understood here that an eminent Russian jurist will be selected as umpire in the Venezuelan dispute. The selection will not be announced officially until the czar has formally given his consent to the appointment. There is some controversy as to whether Great Britain or the United States will approach Russia first on the subject.

TORONTO, Oct. 7.—The Evening Telegram's London cable says that emigration from British ports to Canada for nine months this year was 13,978 British and 5,892 foreigners.

LONDON, Oct. 6.—A despatch from Madrid to the Central News says that serious difficulties have arisen between the ministry and the Bank of Spain. Application was made to the bank for 50,000,000 pesetas on account of the Cuban administration. The committee of the bank held a meeting to consider the application, and virtually refused to advance the money. Thereupon Senor Salvador, the new governor of the bank, demanded that the committee resign.

TACOMA, Wn., October 6.—Henry Bratnober, the celebrated mining expert, for the Rothschilds of London, has reached Tacoma direct from Dawson City. He came over the Dalton trail and made nearly the whole trip alone. When within a hundred miles of Lynn canal he found the mail carriers who were lost and they came the balance of the distance together. Mr. Bratnober left today for San Francisco. He refused to talk about his own business, but said that the amount of gold on the tributaries of the Yukon was not exaggerated.

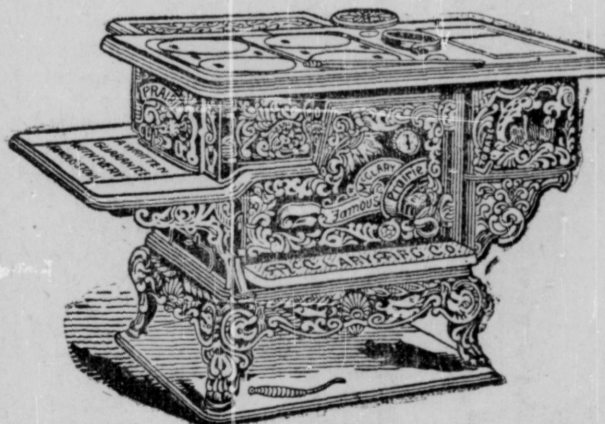
