All that tract, piece or parcel of Land, commencing at a stake set in the north-west angle of one hundred acres of land, the property of Arthur and Archibald Ramsay, thence due north to the south-west angle of land in the possession of Hugh McDonald, and from thence two points by two parallel lines running south seventy-two degrees, east to land in possession of Donald Morrison, containing an area of one hundred Acres of Land, a little more or less, and is part of Lot or Township No. 8, in County and Island aforesaid.
