

Canada Is Being Displaced As Exporter Of Iron Ore

By REFORD MACDUGALL, MONTREAL (CP)—Two years ago Canada was one of the chief exporters of iron ore to Europe. Today she ranks behind countries in Africa, South America and Asia.

P. E. Cavanagh, president of Premium Iron Ores Ltd., has told the Montreal branch of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy that from now on Canadian iron ore firms will have to rely on the North American market and on the few exports to the U.S. that can do so.

Why? This is a question Canadian experts asked when an iron ore trade mission recently visited Britain and the continent.

Their findings: Foreign sources — Algeria, Liberia, Mauritania, Morocco, Sierra Leone and Guinea, Venezuela, Brazil, Chile and Peru, and India and Goa — now offer Europe ores with a higher iron content than any Canadian ore.

Canadian producers could offer a comparable high-grade product containing about 65 per cent iron, but to do so would have to mine 2½ tons of crude ore to produce one ton of saleable high-grade concentrate.

PROGRESS CUTS MARKET Technical developments in methods of making steel in oxygen converters have freed European steelmakers from dependence on Canadian ores.

One trade mission concluded that the world iron ore market situation has changed so rapidly virtually no prospect exist of selling iron ore outside North America for perhaps decades to come.

It was simply a question of price, which Canadian ores could not meet.

What about the United States market, where most of Canada's iron ore now is going?

Here the situation is more encouraging, common technology and competition from low-wage countries less emphatic, say market experts.

U.S. MARKET SAFFER For various reasons—proximity, investment interest, scale of operation, common technology and other factors — Canadian markets in the U.S. are not threatened so immediately.
