LEO GREGORY DOIRON

The residents of St. Charles were shocked and saddened on Sept. 7th by the news of the death of one of their highly respected citizens, Leo Doiron, who passed away suddenly after a brief illness at the Charlestown Hospital.

The deceased was born at Oyster Bed Bridge 63 years ago, and moved to St. Charles where he operated a farm and general store for the past 33 years.

Of a friendly and genial disposition, the deceased was widely and favourably known by a host of friends who enjoyed the kindly hospitality of his home and his remarkable powers of pleasant conversation.

The deceased was sincerely interested in every project for the betterment of the community, and his passing has left a void which will be difficult to fill.

He leaves to mourn the loss of a kind and loving husband and father, his wife the former Maude Devine of Hunter River, one son, Capt. L. G. Depty of External Affairs, Ottawa, and two daughters, Geraldine, Sister Leo Marie of the Mary-Knole sisters, Galvarina, Chile, and Shirley, R.N. Charlestown Hospital. Also three brothers, Aubrey, Preston, Ont., and Elmer, Braintree, Mass. A brother, Leonard, and one sister Florence, Sister Mary Leonard, Newark, N.J. predeceased him some years ago.

The funeral which was largely attended was held Sept. 10th to St. Charles Church where solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated by his pastor, Rev. Charles Gallant, assisted by Rev. George MacDonald, deacon, Rev. Leonard MacDonald sub-deacon and Rev. Edw. Steele, master of ceremonies. Present in the sanctuary were Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. A. Murphy, D.D. of Souris, and Rev. Wilfred Keeffe of Rollo Bay.

Montague Curling Club Opens 1955-56 Season

The Montague Curling Club began the 1955-56 curling season last night with games being played at 7 and 9 o'clock on two perfect sheets of artificial ice.
At the last meeting approximately two weeks ago, it was decided to start the curling season early in December, and for the members this will mean almost four months of curling. Over sixty active members are enrolled this year, together with a number of associate members.
The ladies curling club is also an active group with increased membership and it has been reported that approximately forty high school boys and girls will be curling under the direction of a committee from the men's group.
The president, Mr. Peter Sinclair, feels assured that this will be a most active and interesting year for the local club, and with several important competitions to be staged in this rink during the coming season it may well prove to be one of the most successful years in the history of the Montague Club.
The club had its beginning back in the 1920's when a curling rink, a single ice sheet, was built adjoining the skating rink. Here a nucleus of curling men laid the foundations of curling in Montague. A foundation was laid on Dec. 6, the years, until today it is considered the major sport in Montague. In 1942 with the increased membership, it was deemed necessary to construct a new rink and with the capable assistance of the late Mr. Fred McIntyre, a new building for two ice sheets was constructed.
Membership increased steadily and more and more interest grew in the club. During the past several years, however, with seemingly milder winters, the curling season was becoming quite short on natural ice. As a result last year the members held a meeting at which it was decided to install an artificial ice plant. This was done, and although the curling season began late, nevertheless the members curled for two months, more than they had for the previous several years. This year it was decided to give the members the full benefit of the artificial ice and have as much curling as was reasonable. Consequently the plant was placed in operation about two weeks ago so as to have ice ready early in December.
Today the first competitions will get underway and possibly by the last of this week it will be completed and a mixed bonspiel will be held.

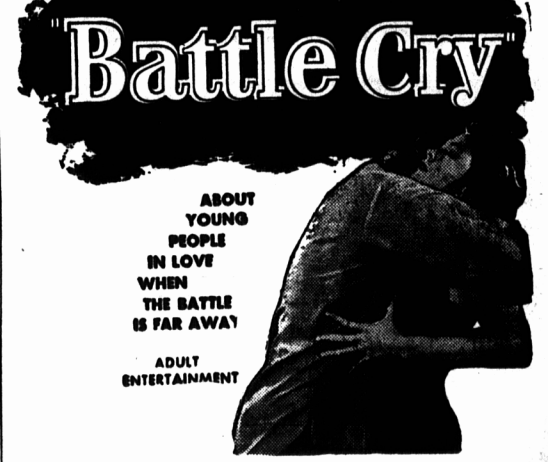
