Chuvvalo Gets Last Chance

Despite all the controversy over the sad state of the fight game, three big matches that could change the whole image of the sport are upcoming and all of them could be real free for all.

The one that will undoubtedly generate the most interest to most local and Canadian fans is the world heavyweight championship bout between Canadian George Chuvvalo and title holder Ernie Terrell.

Chuvvalo has come a long way in the past few years since the brawl he staged against George Cleroux for the Canadian Heavyweight Championship. After he lost the title he disappeared from view for a year but then came up with the move that has put him close to the top of the heap again.

Now, in Chuvvalo's words, "I'm sure of myself" and he has good reason to be. In the matches against Cleroux he seemed to be fighting against himself when he got into trouble, and it did not take too much boxing on Cleroux's part to put him there.

HAS POLISHED STYLE

Chuvvalo used to be a one handed fighter, relying solely on a wicked left hook and an occasional jab but McWhirter has fixed that problem.

Infighting is another of Chuvvalo's fortes and in the opinion of many observers, if the referee of the Chuvvalo-Patterson match had not broken clinches so quickly, that Chuvvalo would have won the bout instead of losing on a split decision.

Chuvvalo's opponent, Ernie Terrell, is an impressive figure, both in and out of the ring. '66", the defending champ is the type of defensive boxer that will point out an opponent but not give him a sound physical thrashing.

Despite this opinion the king of the scrappers, Chuvvalo, will have a large following going into the match and should outclub Terrell for the title.

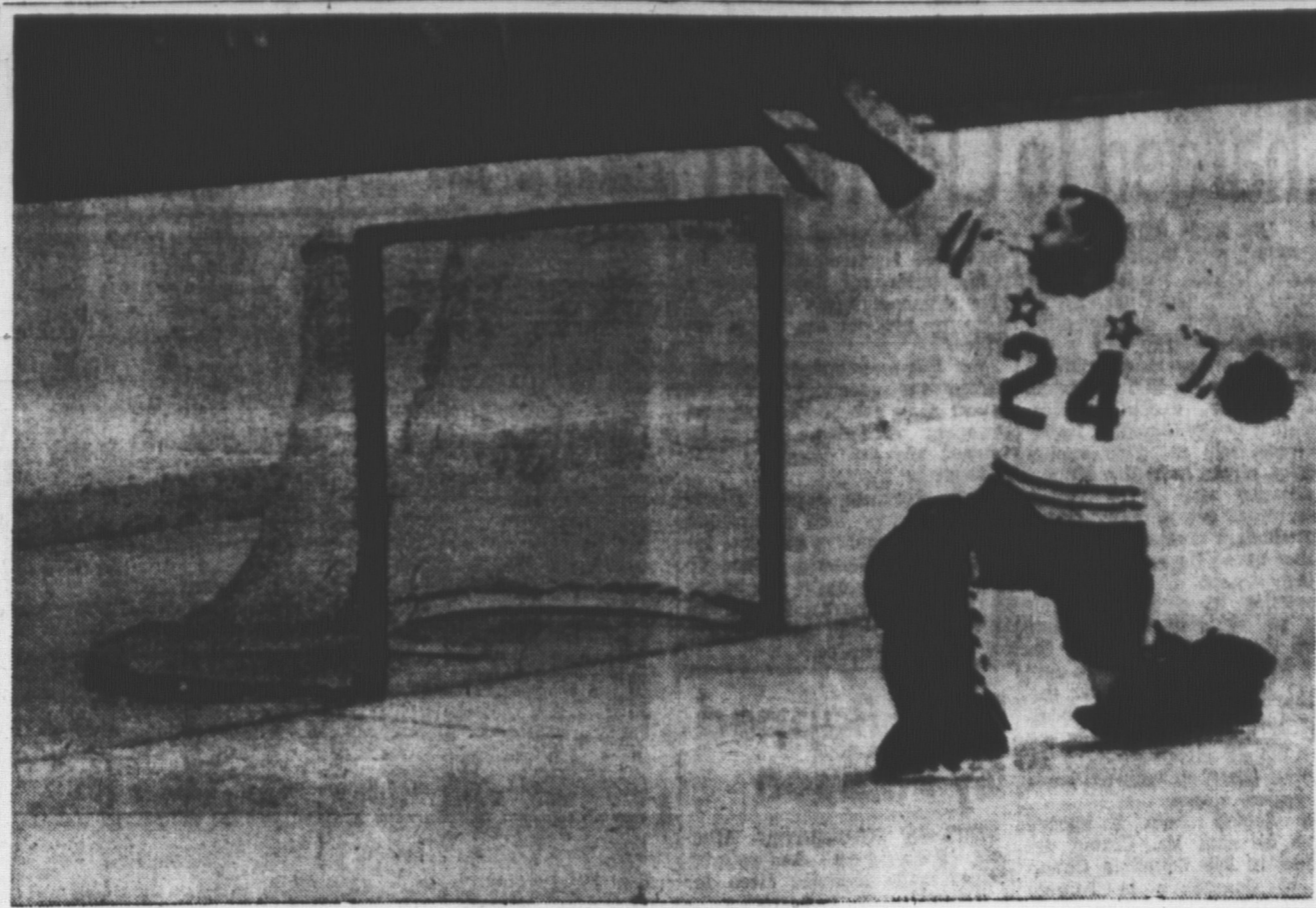
The hockey season is just around a couple of corners, and it looks now as if the Prince County League will function with the same four teams as last year. RCAF, Borden, Combines, and Juniors.

Gordie Howe Leads Stars To 5-2 Victory Over Habs

By AL McNEIL MONTREAL (CP) — Gordie Howe, Detroit Red Wings' right-winger, scored two goals and assisted on two others as the National Hockey League All-Stars defeated Montreal Canadiens 5-2 before 15,531 Forum fans Wednesday night.

The stars got their other markers from Chicago Black Hawks' Bobby Hull, Detroit's Norm Ullman and Johnny Bucyk of Boston Bruins.

Canadiens' captain Jean Beliveau and defenceman Jacques Laperrriere scored goals for the defending Stanley Cup champions.

With his performance in the 19th annual classic, Howe continued to set records. He now has nine goals and seven assists in 17 all-star appearances for a total of 16 points. His nine-goal output gives him two more than the retired Maurice Richard.

Giardello Afraid Of Over-Confidence

By MURRAY ROSE NEW YORK (AP) — Middleweight champion Joey Giardello, who says he fears over-confidence more than he does his foe, was rated the 8-5 underdog Wednesday to Nigeria's Dick Tiger for their 15-round title fight tonight.

They will clash at Madison Square Garden in a return bout. Giardello, the 35-year-old ring veteran from Cherry Hill, N.J., has been guaranteed \$50,000 or 40 per cent of the net receipts of the gate and television.

Tiger, 36, has been guaranteed \$15,000 or 20 per cent of the package. Giardello dethroned Tiger on a 15-round decision in Atlantic City, N.J., Dec. 7, 1963, as a 3-1 underdog. He just can't understand why he's not favored this time.

"Those 8-5 odds favoring him are crazy," said Giardello. "I beat him the last two times I fought him, and I can't see why I shouldn't beat him again. His style is made to order for me. The thing that scares me is that I'm too confident. I can't see how I can lose."

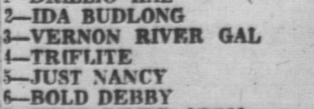

Can. Union Of Students To Sponsor Hockey Team

By STUART LAKE OTTAWA (CP)—Flushed with the success of its participation in the student Olympic Games at Budapest last summer, the Canadian Union of Students now is making plans to send a Canadian university hockey team to the winter Universiade at Torino, Italy, in February.

Paul Ladouceur, sports director of the students union, said Wednesday that at least two university teams are interested in representing Canada in the hockey tournament. These are the University of Toronto and the University of Alberta at Edmonton.

All universities have been asked to submit applications and there's a chance that an elimination series will be held if enough teams express interest. Applications must be in by Nov. 15.

Canada sent a 10-member team to the summer games—the first time this country was represented—and won one gold medal and three bronze medals.

WANT CANADIAN TEAM

Ladouceur, who accompanied the team to Budapest, said officials running the winter games are most anxious to have a Canadian hockey team take part. Hockey hasn't been a resounding success in the winter games because of lack of entries—it's felt that a Canadian entry in the 1966 games would spark interest among other countries.

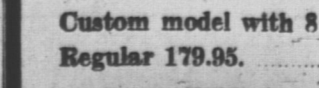
