## POPE LEO XIII IN POOR HEALTH

Said to be Suffering  
From Pneumonia

AND IS NOT EXPECTED TO RECOVER.

The Pontiff has been Suffering From a Cold for two Days.

ROME, March 1.—The Pope had a fatiguing day on Monday receiving congratulations on the approaching anniversary of his coronation, and complained of a cold which he has had for two days.

Yesterday morning he complained of a pain in the side.

Dr. Lapponi found some fever and ordered the patient to remain in bed and take a complete rest.

It is almost certain that the Pontifical receptions and ceremonies fixed for March 2nd and March 4th will be countermanded.

LONDON, March 1.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Mail says it is feared that the Pope has pneumonia and will not recover. Cardinal Oreglia Dayow, of the Sacred College, has been in the apartment of His Holiness the entire evening.

It is reported that R. W. and H. D. McEwen have purchased the lobster factory of Haybolt & McEwen, at St. Peter's Harbor.

The Liberal-Conservative meeting in Morell Hall on the 23rd was well attended, although a blunder in not having it advertised in THE WEEKLY EXAMINER prevented many from attending. The district is now perfectly organized and waiting for the fray, confident of victory next time. The following officers were elected, viz:

Resolutions expressing the great loss the party in general and this association in particular has sustained by the death of the late President, J. P. Sullivan, Esq., and vice President J. A. McLaine, Esq., was unanimously adopted.

A meeting was held in Morell hall on Friday 24th to take into consideration a proposition of Wm Campbell, Esq, for the formation of a company with a capital of about \$3000 to place on the market the mussel mud deposits of St. Peter's Bay. His plan is to load scows by a steam dredge and with the aid of a tug boat land these scows at various places along the bay shores to be disposed of to farmers in summer. There are millions of tons of this valuable fertilizer which can't be got in winter owing to various reasons. We think the proposition quite feasible if the money can be raised.
