A former Island missionary couple and their four children have been evacuated from the northeastern Congo in the face of communist-backed rebel activity there. The Guardian learned yesterday from James Sahr, preacher in the Charlottetown Bible Chapel.

They are Mr. and Mrs. Ewen MacDougall, Mr. MacDougall is the son of Mrs. E. M. MacDougall and the late Mr. MacDougall of Morel, and his wife is the former Marie Gallant of Charlottetown. Apparently, the couple and their children are safe in Uganda, a British protectorate bordering the Congo. It was from Uganda that Mr. Sahr received the letter telling of the evacuation.

All other missionaries from the MacDougall's station have also found it necessary to leave, the letter said.

The MacDougalls were sent out as missionaries by the Fairview Bible Chapel in Fairview, N.S., where the family was residing at the time of their departure for Africa in June of this year.
