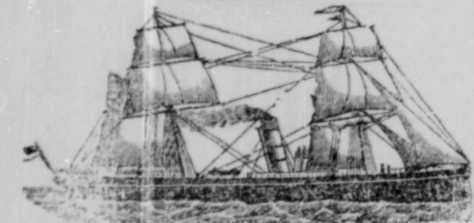

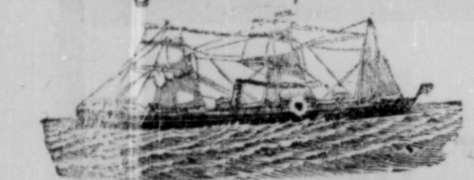

### Of Special Interest to our Farmers

#### Piling Manure Before Drawing.

Where scattered coarse manure is to be drawn out and spread for plowing under in the spring, it is best to gather it in piles and let it ferment, if only for a few days, rather than to keep the teams idle while men are slowly scraping the manure together. By piling it up there is a double advantage, as more of the manure will be secured and the slight fermentation it will get in the heap will make it much more available than manure that has laid scattered and exposed through the winter. There is a further advantage in piling it up if some of the rich black mold under the manure is mixed with it. This is the remains of manure left scattered in previous years, together with some of the soluble fertility in the stable manure that has lain above it the past winter. Most barnyards are larger than they need to be. It is wasteful of manure to leave it scattered, and also requires too much labor in getting manure together, says American Cultivator.

#### Agricultural Brevities.

The perfection attained by Japanese fruits and seeds is due to very thorough cultivation and fertilizing. Their entire system of agriculture is slow, laborious and painstaking, but the results are marvelous in quality and quantity of produce.

It is claimed that if the crusade against the gypsy moth were stopped the insect would multiply beyond all possibility of control and Massachusetts could easily pass the pest along and share her trouble with her neighbors.

Now is a good time to make plantings of horse radish.

Boxes or barrels over the rhubarb plants will hasten growth and blanch the stalks.

A very handy thing to have around the apiary when handling bees is a piece of burlap large enough to cover over the hive. This should be made wet, and after wringing the water out it may be used to cover the hive when the cover is off and will keep the bees down on the side where you are not working, says American Gardening.

#### Water for Calves.

In order to determine how much water the herd of 13 calves at the Kansas Agricultural college would drink, the water given them for a week was weighed and put in a barrel with an attachment for letting it out as fast as needed. In the seven days the 13 calves drank 868 pounds of water, or an average of 66 pounds a day. The weather during this time was warm for the first three days and cool the last four days. In addition the calves got an average of 14 pounds of skim-milk, besides grain and hay. The calves drank several times a day, not much at a time, but often. I noticed several times that they took only one or two swallows. Oftentimes they would take a few mouthfuls of grain, go and get two or three sups of water, then back to their grain again. Even after their rations of milk they would take a few swallows of water. This experiment shows that calves need water in addition to their milk ration; it also shows that they like it often and not

#### Milk From Individual Cows.

Twenty years ago milkmen were greatly bothered by customers who demanded the milk from one cow regularly. They thought this insured a more uniform sample of milk. That idea is now pretty well exploded. Herd milk, or the milk of all the cows thoroughly milked, is safer and more uniform in the long run than the milk of any single cow.—Rural New Yorker.

#### How to Make Great Corn Land.

The southern cowpeas in the north are of value only as a green fallow crop to turn under. They grow, even in thin soil, with much more vigor and make a large crop to turn under, growing in 60 days, rooting very deep. We have dug out roots that went down in heavy clay two feet, and then there was more to follow after. The land should be made good and the peas—rather beans, for beans they are—should be drilled fairly well into the ground. Some put in a few outs, but whether this pays we have doubts. These peas should not be put in before June 1, when the soil is both hot and fairly moist, but after this they will grow without much rain. They should not be allowed to get too ripe before turning under. Where land is very much run down it would be a good plan to turn them under in early September and work in a sowing of Canadian peas on the same ground the last of September—about the 20th—let them grow and lie on the land through the winter as mulch, adding so many more roots, humus and fertility to the soil, and the following year it will make great corn land—if an experience of mine is any guide in the matter, says John Gould in the Ohio Farmer.
