Unexplained Earth Tremor Jars Homes, Wakens People

Residents of Mount Stewart and surrounding area were awakened at 5 o'clock yesterday morning by an explosion of undetermined origin.

Homes in the area were shaken and cattle in the fields stampeded.

Reports have reached The Guardian that at approximately the same time residents in Charlottetown, Southport and communities surrounding the area also experienced a loud noise which "seemed to shake the ground, like an earth tremor."

Although the RCMP and other sources were able to give no official explanation of the incident, it is believed that the blast was caused by a jet plane breaking the sound barrier at some point over the island.

At least one source described the sound of a passing airplane shortly after the incident, but it said that the plane, though it sounded like a jet, seemed to be moving too slowly to have just raced past the speed of sound.

There were no reports of a chunder in the area at the time.
