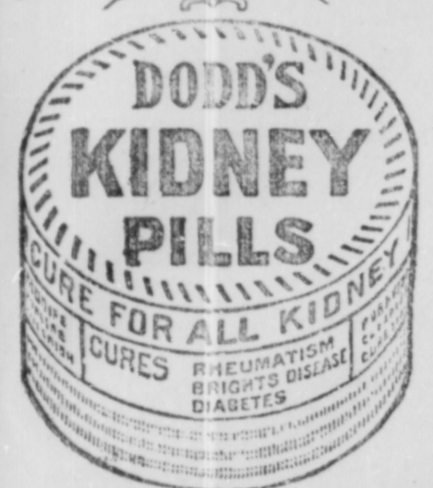

THE MAGDALEN ISLANDS.

Interesting Description by a Recent Resident.

The Magdalen Islands are a small group about sixty miles long, lying in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, forty miles north of Prince Edward Island. The first isle sighted is Entry, then Amherst, Grindstone, Alright, Grosse Ile and Byron. The population is about six thousand. The majority of the people are of French descent and gain their livelihood by seal-hunting in February and March, and fishing during the summer months. On Entry Island the people are all English, having an English Church of their own although they consist of only a few families.

At Grindstone there are about twenty-seven English families, all the others are French. Grosse Ile, the largest island, and Byron, all are English.

There are four English churches, at Entry, Amherst, Grindstone and Grosse Ile, besides which English church services are conducted at Grand Entry all the year, and at Byron, during the summer months.

There are four Roman Catholic churches at Amherst, Grindstone, House Harbor and Grand Entry.

The school houses, both French and English, are in a better condition than the majority of the country schools of P. E. Island.

There are well equipped business stands on each island with the exception of Entry. There are no large hotels, yet, accommodation, at liberal rates, can be had.

The climate is about the same as P. E. Island; but the high winds make it seem colder, and make it very unhealthy for consumptive persons.

The soil is very fertile; but agriculture is not in such a high state of cultivation as it might be. All kinds of fruit trees have been planted, but for some unknown reason they do not thrive. One finds spruce, fir and birch on any of the islands. It is a pleasure to drive from Grindstone to Grosse Ile and find the beach literally covered with wild strawberries, almost as large as any tame ones found elsewhere. On Byron Island are found berries of all kinds.

A steamer runs to the Magdalen Islands weekly, from May 1st to December 21st or 22nd, although there is nothing to prevent a steamer running till the last of January or the middle of February as there is open water around the island, until the drift ice comes in about March the 1st.

During the winter months, although there is no communication with the outside world except the cable, yet there is a weekly local mail which helps to break the monotony of the long winter. Though the spring is sometimes somewhat late, yet one is amply repaid for waiting by the appearance of the hills and valleys, the wood being one mass of mayflowers as early as April.

The scenery, from steamer or vessel, on approaching Grindstone is grand. Coming on deck in the early dawn, the gray, bold rocks rise to our view, the little churches on the hills and the cottages dotted below pay one well for the pangs of "Mida Mer" endured on the passage over. Among the rocks, the rock and cliffs are of such various colors that one can hardly believe it anything but artificial.

I trust this will give the readers some faint idea of Magdalen Islands and that, they, in the near future, will visit there and find out for themselves, the beauties with which Mother Nature has endowed those "Isles of the North," and when they leave will say "Isles of Beauty, Fare-Thee-Well."

S. S. Lunenburg leaves Pictou for Magdalen Islands, every Monday on the arrival of the Halifax mail, calling at Georgetown and Souris, leaves Souris between nine and ten o'clock p. m., and reaches Magdalen Islands for an early breakfast.

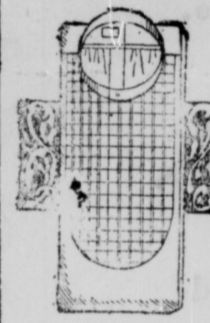

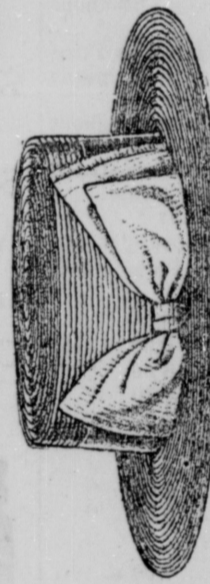
