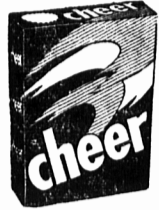

Celebrated Poet To Speak At S. D. U.

The internationally-known South African poet, Roy Campbell, will deliver a public lecture at St. Dunstan's College the evening of October 23. He will read from and interpret his own work, and describe the background and experiences out of which his poems grew.

An experienced and forceful platform and radio speaker, Mr. Campbell's lectures at Oxford and Cambridge universities two years ago were exceptionally popular. He has also lectured frequently in Spain and Portugal in recent years.

In his writing, and in his lectures, Mr. Campbell is able to draw upon the resources of an interesting and unusually varied career. He was born and spent the first twenty years of his life in South Africa, and has always kept in close touch with literary and political life in that part of the world. He spent the late twenties and early thirties in England. He is also at home in Spain, as well as in Portugal where he now lives. A veteran soldier, he fought through the Spanish civil war on the side of Franco, and in World War II, he served for four years with the British army in the African colonies and in the desert campaigns. At various times he has made his living as a sailor, fisherman, rancher, and bullfighter.

Mr. Campbell first became widely known with the publication of "The Flaming Terrapin" in 1922. He was then only 19. Since then he has had over a dozen books published. These include several volumes of poetry, an autobiography, and three books of translations from Lorca, Baudelaire, and St. John of the Cross.

Mr. Campbell, on a two-months tour of North America, will lecture in many cities and at leading universities in the United States and in Canada.

Knights Of Columbus To Observe 50th Anniversary

The Charlottetown Council of the Knights of Columbus, under Grand Knight Walter J. Morrissey, have announced plans for their fiftieth anniversary. The program will consist of a Holy Hour at St. Dunstan's Basilica on Sunday, November 1st, in which the Knights will unite their prayers in public worship. A Guard of Honor will be provided by Bishop MacEachern Assembly, Fourth Degree. On Wednesday evening, November 4th, the Knights will meet at the Charlottetown Hotel to partake of a banquet and to hear an address by Brother Gregory T. Feeney, member of the Supreme Board of Directors of the Order and State Deputy for the Province of New Brunswick. A highlight of the banquet will be the reply to the toast to the Charter Members. This toast will be responded to by one of the original founders of the Council.

It was on December 6th, 1903 that a group of sixty-five men from all parts of Prince Edward Island saw their plans of several years brought to fulfillment in the organization of Charlottetown Council No. 824. It was only a few years previously, in 1882, that the Order had been founded in New Haven, Conn. Since then it had spread throughout the United States and to a few of the larger centres in Canada. The principles upon which the Order was founded, charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism appealed to this group of Islanders and with many of their friends and relatives in the United States joining the Order and telling of its work in letters home and during visits to the Island, interest grew until the organization of a Council was the next logical step.

Among the relatives and visitors who brought word of the Order to the Island was Father, now Bishop Kelly, a relative of John M. Hedges, one of the charter members. Other Islanders who became interested were James J. Johnston, the first Grand Knight of the new Council, Joseph Gallagher, James Eden, Charles Hermans and Alex MacDonaid.

In September 1902, Father Martin Monaghan, then a Curate in Charlottetown, while visiting mature each year.

The 1954-1960 maturities are being offered at 4.25 and the 1964-1973 at 4.60. Proceeds will be used for schools, road equipment and other municipal purposes.

Frank MacDonald, later Father Frank, in South Framingham, Mass., arranged a meeting with Supreme Knight Ahearn for the purpose of organizing the Council in Charlottetown. The promise was given by the Supreme Knight and from then on it was plain sailing, although final arrangements took over a year to complete. Finally the date was set, and on 6 December, 1903 a deputation team from Ontario conferred the First and Second Degrees and a team from Boston conferred the Third Degree, the Council Officers were elected and installed in office and Charlottetown Council came into being, the first Council of the Order in the Maritime Provinces.

Since then the Council has grown steadily from the original sixty-six to its present three hundred and fifty. For a time all Knights on the Island belonged to this Council, later, as the membership grew, Councils were established at Summerside and Souris to accommodate the members in these areas.

Of the original Charter members only ten survive: Mr. Justice A. E. Arsenault, Vincent Blake, Judge C. G. Duffy, James M. Hennessey, James Landrigan, L. B. MacMillan, Rev. M. Monaghan, J. F. Reardon, M. W. Reardon, J. J. Trainor and Rt. Rev. Gregory J. McLeilan. To these men and to the others who have passed to their eternal reward, the following is appropriate: "They builded better than they knew."

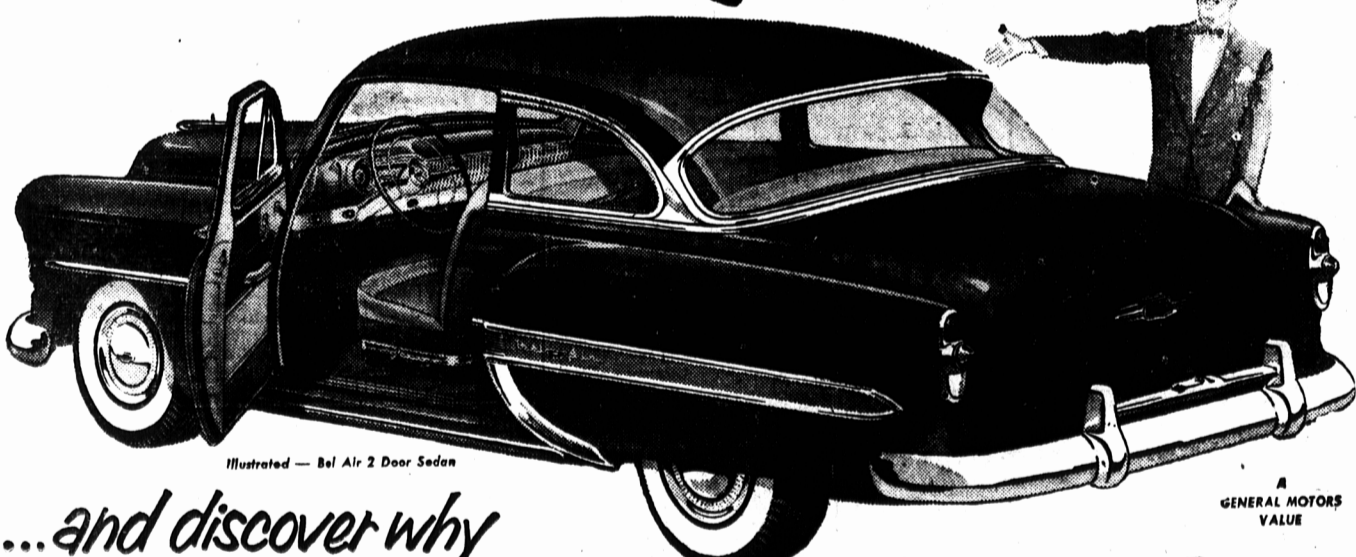
