Lobster Fishermen Start Day Earlier

The lobster season gets under way a day earlier this year as fishermen are being permitted to run lines and traps on the last day of April, although they are not permitted to land lobsters until the first day of May. This is a change in the ruling which in the past called for line running on the first day of May, the official opening day.

Another change noted this year is that of the method of measuring the lobsters. The former method of seven inches overall length for canners has been changed to 2 1/2 inches carapace measure from the eye socket to the back of the body shell. Actually this does not involve a great difference in the overall length, and if anything makes it a little shorter.

All along the east coast of the Island and the North Shore fishermen are making last minute preparations for line running day on April 30th. New traps, rope and newly painted boats dot the shoreline as fishermen make ready to move to their base of operations.

Several boats from Montague and Lower Montague are moving to Launching and North Shore, while others will be fishing out of Georgetown and landing their catch at Georgetown, Montague, Gaspereaux and Murray Harbour.

Although still early some fishermen think that it looks like a good season. Ice formation along the coast, except for a few closed places where wind has brought in a small ice pack, has practically disappeared, and fishermen hope to have no difficulty in running their lines.
