**H**IS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in Council was this day pleased to fix and determine the rate at which the amount of the Invoice of Dutiable Goods, imported into this Island from the United States of America, shall, in estimating the duties payable thereon, be reduced into current money of the Island, as follows:—

In all cases where such Invoices shall be made out in Dollars and Cents of the paper currency of the United States, the amount of such Invoice shall be reduced into current money of this Island, by allowing for each Dollar the sum of FOUR SHILLINGS AND SIX-PENCE, and in the like proportion for any fraction of a Dollar; of which all Collectors of Impost are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Fixed White Light,	-	-	45 Seconds.
Eclipse,	-	-	5 1/4 "
Flash,	-	-	4 1/2 "
Eclipse,	-	-	5 1/4 "
			60 Seconds.

In consequence of the Arrangements to be made for substituting the new apparatus to the old one, and necessary repairs to the Light House, the present Light will cease to be shewn from the night of TUESDAY, the Ninth day of JULY, 1867, until the night of THURSDAY, the First day of AUGUST, 1867, being the time fixed for putting the new light in operation.
