A PLOT TO BURN SHANGHAI

General Situation there is Critical.

IMPORTANT SPEECH OF UNDER SECRETARY BRODERICK.

He Reviews the Situation in China at Present.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

BERLIN, Aug. 30.—The Frankfort Zeitung has received a despatch from Shanghai saying a plot has been discovered to burn the whole city. It is added that Europeans consider the streets unsafe after nightfall, and the general situation is described as critical.

LONDON, Aug. 30.—William Broderick, Under Secretary of State of Foreign Affairs, speaking last evening at Thoracombe, said the situation in China was considerably involved because there was no Chinese Government with which to negotiate.

"Great Britain," continued the Under-Secretary, "while prepared to support the loyal viceroys of South China who have stood aloof from this insurrection, and while prepared also to preserve British trade with China, will claim some penalty or indemnity for damage wrought. Nevertheless we cannot undertake to govern China ourselves or with the assistance of the other powers."

LONDON, August 30.—Under the growing difficulties of the Chinese embargo, under Secretary Broderick's emphatic declaration at Thorncombe proves that the British government does not yet see any cause to depart from the line of policy originally decided upon, namely to take no responsibility for the administration of China.

Broderick said that he hoped it would not be supposed that the government was pusillanimous in this respect. Its object was to maintain British interests. It was quite ready to take a share of the "white man's burden," but it could not admit that the nature of that burden should be dictated to it by the yellow man.

"Here," the Morning Post observes, "is where the difficulty of selecting a policy comes in. We cannot decamp and leave the powers to settle the matter between them."

The despatches received this morning bring no later Peking news.

THE GOVERNMENT DECIED

The Machine's Victim Upheld by the People.

WINNIPEG, August 28.—As an evidence of dissatisfaction among the old time Liberals with the present Government the meetings now being held by R. L. Richardson, M. P., furnish a good example. Everywhere he is listened to by crowds, who enthusiastically applaud his denunciations of the Ottawa Government for its broken pledges on its fiscal tariff and railway policy. The farmers are unanimous in their support of Richardson's stand on this matter, and the breach between them and the Grit machine men grows daily wider. At Miami, last night, Richardson received one of the greatest ovations of his political career, farmers driving over twenty miles to attend his meeting.

RIFLE SHOOTING AT OTTAWA

Island Marksmen are Doing Well.

NAMES OF THE ISLANDERS AND THEIR SCORES

Private Graham Wins First Prize in Walker Match.

OTTAWA, Aug. 30.—In the Dominion matches the first prize in the Walker match was won by Private F. F. Graham, of Dundas, with 65 points. He takes the cup and \$25. Lieut. Acorn, of Charlottetown won \$8 with 62 points. Captain Wetmore, of St. John, stands second in the aggregate with 341 points.

ANOTHER DESPATCH.

OTTAWA, Aug. 30.—In the Kirkpatrick match Sergt.-Major Otto Baird made 60 points and won \$10. Lieut. H. R. Lordly, with 58 points, won \$6. Corporal Geo. Blue made 56 points and won \$5.

The following Island marksmen won \$4 each: Lieut. Acorn, Captain Jones, Sergt. J. A. Moore and Major H. M. Davison.

Lieut. Lordly made the highest possible at six hundred yards in this match.

The weather is slightly cooler. The Island team is shooting well, scoring very high.

RIFLE RANGE, Ottawa, Aug. 30.—In the Walker match, Lieut. J. H. C. Acorn made 62 points and won \$8; Major H. M. Davison made 61 points and won \$8; Lieut. J. M. Davison won \$5.

The Minister of Militia Match is now this afternoon being shot, the ranges (being 800 and 900 yards).

At 800 yards Lieut. J. M. Davison made the highest possible score.

In the League Series the Island boys win two handsome trophies.

CONVALESCENT SOLDIERS

Explanation of Delay in Sending Them Home.

OTTAWA, Aug. 28.—The delay in sending the convalescent soldiers to their homes is probably accounted for by the fact that only on Aug 1 did the war office issue the regulations regarding the treatment to be accorded to those who might be in hospital in England. The regulations, a copy of which was received by the Minister of Militia to day, provides for free transportation to the colony and a grant of five pounds for each man. In every case careful note is to be taken of the soldier's intended address, with a view of ensuring his sharing in any general war gratuity or issue of medals which may hereafter be awarded. A postscript to the War Office circular has the following sympathetic remarks: "The Marquis of Lansdowne desired me to impress upon you that many of these men are quite ignorant of the military rules prevailing in this country and unfamiliar with discipline and request that you make it your business to explain to them fully and in good time the intentions of the War Office in regard to them."

SERVICE IN SOUTH AFRICA

Col. Otter Heard From Again

DIFFERENCE IN THE FORMS OF ENLISTMENT.

Asks That Canadians Remain in South Africa.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, Aug. 30.—Following up the recent communication from Col. Otter with reference to the period of service in South Africa a despatch was yesterday received by the Militia Department from Chamberlain enclosing one from Roberis in which he calls attention to the difference in the forms of enlistment between English volunteers and the corps of the Canadian regiment.

The former, it appears, were enlisted for one year whereas the term of service for the Canadians for one year terminates on the 15th of October. The Command-in-Chief asks that the Canadians be given permission to remain in South Africa for two or three months after the expiration of their term of enlistment.

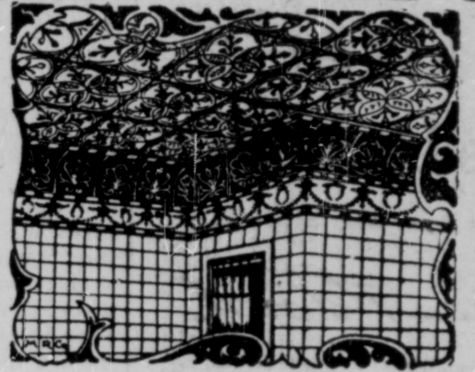
