TORONTO, (CP)—Stock market prices attempted a recovery Tuesday from a three-week decline but failed to muster sufficient support.

Base metals showed the largest loss. Golds weakened but Western oils held firm.

Volume was 4,545,000 shares. Bonville, a uranium prospect, was the heaviest traded, moving 1,341,000 shares to gain 11 cents.

Gunbar dropped a fraction and Nesbit Labine dropped pennies. New Brunswick base metals were firm as Brunhurst added pennies. Keyboyton and Brunswick slipped.

Higher-priced base metals weakened and Hudson Bay dropped \$1. Steep Rock, Campbell Chibougamay and East Sullivan lost. Mindamar and Eastern Metals gained.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, (CP)—Broad export demand for Canadian barley highlighted trade on the Winnipeg grain exchange Tuesday as prices generally held to a narrow range.

In one of the largest export showings for several weeks, about 1,000,000 bushels of Canadian barley were taken by British buyers. This business was reflected by higher prices at the close. Oats were less active but managed to show minor gains.

Offerings were more liberal in rye and flax, and prices in both grains showed declines.

Export loadings of Canadian wheat overnight totalled more than 2,000,000 bushels, including: the United Kingdom 685,000; Belgium 390,000; Peru 370,000; Brazil 350,000; Germany 300,000; Libya 180,000 and Italy 75,000.

Prices for class two wheat were down one cent from Monday; IWA prices were unchanged.
