News Notes

Dakota reports indicate a greater crop for this year than has ever before been gathered there.

A special cable from London says that Premier Whiteley and Mr. Harvey, of Newfoundland, have not yet seen Lord Salisbury. After a brief interview with Lord Knutsford, they are preparing a formal statement of Newfoundland's case for submission to the colonial office. An outline of this case formulates the demands of the colony very clearly and forcibly. The delegates will urge on the Imperial Government that France should abolish or materially reduce her fish bounties. Newfoundland in return will give France all facilities for the purchase of bait. Treaty rights will then be found to die a natural death, or will be made a subject of subsidiary agreements.

A special from Tincup, Colorado, gives an account of what is claimed to be the most wonderful discovery of gold ever reported. The find is six miles from Tincup on Cross Mountain, and is owned by McCormack and Lewis. Between the two lines there are ten feet in thickness, the lower six feet iron manganese, the upper gold bearing quartz of free gold. The lowest assay from the rock is \$440 per ton and there are specimens which put through a common mortar returns \$20,000 in gold to the ton. Two men are now taking \$75,000 per day. If this streak is only one yard in depth, and extends the full length of the claim, 1,500 feet, there is \$663,000 gold in it. If the dip goes down 1,000 feet it is worth \$187,479,000. The average value is placed at \$1,000 per ton. The excitement over the discovery is intense and thousands of miners are rushing into the camp.
