

# Military Attaches Due To Visit Ch'town Today

A large group of 19 foreign country military attaches accredited to Canada will visit Charlottetown today as part of a tour of Eastern Canada. They will be accompanied by several Commonwealth Service advisors, three Canadian service personnel.

In the group will be Capt. S. M. Anwar, naval advisor, Pakistan; Lieut. A.L. Bader, assistant naval attaché, United States; Cmdr. G.L. Coates, assistant naval advisor, Great Britain; Brig. T.C. Campbell, naval and military advisor, New Zealand; Capt. J. Curstj, naval advisor, India; Air Col. G. Constantine, military air and naval attaché, Italy;

Col. G. Kokkas, air attaché, Greece; Capt. S.J. Markovic, naval attaché, Yugoslavia; Col. U.O. Mielonen, military attaché, Sweden; Wing Cmdr. D.A. Oxby, assistant air advisor, Great Britain; Col. C.J. Parsons, military attaché, United States; Col. Y. Ruppel, mili-

tary, naval and air attaché, France; Cmdr. G. E. Thayer, naval attaché, Germany; Col. K. Tofugu, air, military and naval attaché, Turkey; Rear Admiral R.A. Tamber, naval attaché, Norway; Col. E. Huthmann, air and military attaché, Germany; Capt. N.F. Lange, naval attaché, Denmark.

The visitors will arrive by RCAF plane shortly after noon today and will stay at the Charlottetown Hotel.

Since it is a purely civic visit to acquaint them with various parts of Canada, their call has no military significance and local service authorities were not requested to do any planning.

Shortly after arrival the advisers will pay a formal call on Lieutenant Governor F. Walter Hyndman at Government House. In the evening they will be guests of the City of Charlottetown at a reception and dinner at the Charlottetown Hotel.

# MCA's Dart Heralds To Start Service Oct. 1

The Handley Page Dart Herald, England's latest turbo-prop airplane, will be placed in service on Oct. 1, by Maritime Central Airways on its Island services.

The new aircraft will take over the daily flights to and from the Magdalen Islands, Halifax, Moncton and New Glasgow. The company's second Dart Herald will be introduced to the northern services to Labrador and New Brunswick during the same period.

The Dart Herald is a 46 seat airliner that is fully cabin pressurized and cruises at speeds up to 270 miles per hour. The unique high wing design, along with large oval windows, provides passengers with picture window vision while flying.

MCA purchased four Dart Heralds from the Handley Page Co. Ltd. in the United Kingdom. The aircraft are being delivered to MCA in stages. The first Dart Herald was delivered to MCA in August 1961.

# RC Churchmen Reply To Retiring UC Head

TORONTO (CP) — Roman Catholic churchmen here hit back at a statement by the retiring United Church moderator that liberty may end in Canada because immigration is making this country predominantly Catholic.

Rt. Rev. Hugh A. McLeod told the 20th general council of the United Church of Canada Wednesday night the influx of Catholics "may herald and hit back at a statement by the retiring United Church moderator that liberty may end in Canada because immigration is making this country predominantly Catholic."

His statements were termed "irresponsible" by Rt. Rev. Thomas B. Fulton of the Catholic Archdiocese of Toronto's chancery office.

In an interview Thursday the Monsignor said: "It is difficult to see how such irresponsible statements are consistent with the Christian spirit or conducive to harmony or understanding in the community."

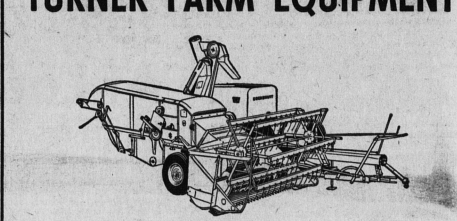
Statements were made Thursday by a number of leading Toronto churchmen.

Rev. C. J. Mulvihill, director of Catholic family services, said the suggestion of loss of liberty was "ridiculous".

He said the Canada Immigration Act does not place any restrictions on an immigrant's religion.

# S'side Shoe Shop Break Case Hearings Opened

SUMMERSIDE — The preliminary hearings of Joseph Ivan Arsenault and George Gallant Jr. of Summerside charged separately with breaking into Fraser and Son shoe repair shop on Granville Street, Summerside, in the early morning of last July 26 opened Thursday in police court before Magistrate Richard S. Hinton, QC.

After evidence of seven crown witnesses was heard the hearings were adjourned until Sept. 20 at which time they are expected to be further adjourned as defence counsel J. Watson MacNaught, QC, told the court he would be out of town until Sept. 25.

Clarence Fraser, proprietor of Fraser and Son told of being summoned to his establishment around 1.00 a.m. on July 26 where he found constables Stewart Berry and Blair Buell. He said a window at the rear of the small building was broken and there were two hats in the shop.

IDENTIFIES HAT Edgar Arsenault, father of

Ivan Arsenault, identified one of the hats produced by Police Chief S.D.A. Wannamaker, acting for the crown as similar to one he owned and added "either one of the boys could have had it on" the night of the break. Mr. Arsenault was referring to his two sons.

Gordon Kelly, a partner with his brother in the firm of Victory Dry Cleaners, showed the court a file copy of an invoice which contained the same number as that on a dry cleaning tag attached to the inside of one of the hats which were entered as exhibits. The invoice was dated October 24, 1961, and was made out to Edgar Arsenault.

Defence Counsel J. Watson MacNaught objected on the grounds the copy was not the original.

Mrs. Mac Arsenault identified the handwriting on the invoice as being hers and also stated the invoice number on the dry cleaning tag on the hat, that Mr. Arsenault stated was

similar to one he owned, were the same.

ANSWERED CALL Police Officer Stewart Berry said that as a result of a phone call he and police officer Blair Buell went to Fraser and Son shoe repair shop around 12.30 a.m. July 26.

Cst. Berry testified he shone his flashlight in the front door and saw a man climbing out the rear window. He dashed around to the rear, telling Cst. Buell to guard the front, and found Ivan Arsenault in a crouched position a few feet away from the Fraser shop. After placing Arsenault in the police wagon, the two officers went to the rear of the building again and discovered George Gallant, Jr., lying under some bushes. They took the pair to jail and noticed blood on their hands, Cst. Berry stated. This evidence was corroborated by Cst. Buell.

Cst. Elmer Matheson told of going to the Fraser and Son shop around 9 a.m., July 26 with Cst. Fred Connolly of the RCMP to conduct fingerprinting. He said Mr. Fraser pointed out two hats that were found in the shop. Cst. Matheson identified the two hats in court as the same two given him by Mr. Fraser through his handwriting and initials placed on the inside of the hats on July 26.

Mrs. MacNaught objected to the evidence of Mr. Kelly, Mrs. Mac Arsenault, Edgar Arsen-

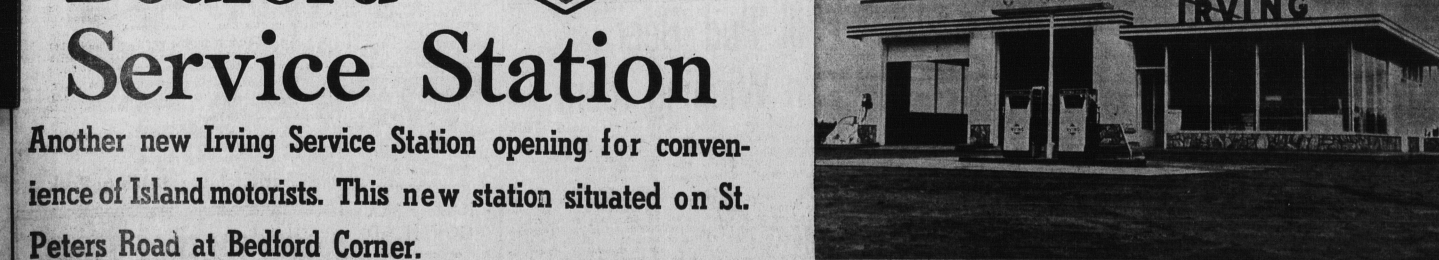
Other features are the keep luggage overhead racks, the clearly audible public address system, and the low floor level which greatly simplifies boarding and disembarking of passengers — especially women and children.
