Ten thousand young trees were  
 planted this spring by Galt, Ont.  
 Scouts on their newly acquired  
 camp site, Peacehaven, near  
 Drumbo.

The building of a 27-foot whaler

 sturdy, roomy craft, and will per-  
 mit of lengthy training cruises.

Alfred Scadding, of the Moose  
 River Mine tragedy, was formerly  
 Assistant Scoutmaster of the late  
 Queenston, Ont., Scout Troop. "He  
 was a man who could meet any  
 emergency," states a Question  
 correspondent in the "Niagara Falls  
 Review." The lighting of the smoke  
 signal fire which first informed  
 rescuers that the men were still  
 alive was attributed to Scadding's  
 Scout signalling ingenuity.

Hamilton, Ont. Sea Scouts will  
 shortly become the happy posses-  
 sors of a coast guard station, in  
 the form of an old excursion  
 steamer, the "Brockville," perman-  
 ently anchored at La Salle wharf,  
 through the co-operation of the  
 Hamilton Harbour Commission. The  
 boat will be equipped with tele-  
 scopes and wireless, to be used in  
 discovering and assisting with mis-  
 happens on Hamilton Bay. The "Brock-  
 ville" formerly plied between the  
 city of that name and a summer  
 resort, Butternut Bay.

A successful Folklore Festival,  
 which included the singing of old  
 river songs of the St. Maurice River  
 Valley, was an achievement of the  
 Jacques Cartier Troop of Catholic  
 Scouts of Three Rivers, Que. In  
 preparation for the festival a party  
 of older Scouts was sent up the  
 river to interview old folks of the  
 district and secure the words and  
 tunes of old time chansons, and

 were congratulated by the City  
 Council upon the success of their  
 venture. The Folklore Festival may  
 become an annual event.

A 60-acre camp site has been  
 given by Mr. John R. Green to  
 the Boy Scouts of Moose Jaw, Sask.

Over consecutive week-ends in  
 May a party of 135 Scouts from six  
 Toronto troops visited Buffalo, and  
 110 Buffalo Scouts visited Toronto.

The Canadian lads paced a wreath  
 on the memorial to President Wil-  
 liam McKinley and the American  
 boys paid a similar tribute at the  
 Cenotaph before the Toronto City  
 Hall.

Tree planting on Ontario's first  
 major Boy Scout reforestation pro-  
 ject, a 30-acre "Scout Forest" at  
 Angus, near Lake Simcoe, was com-  
 pleted by Scouts attending the 7th  
 Annual Scout Forestry Camp over  
 the recent Empire Day week-end.

The planting of the last vacant  
 area was carried out by 116  
 boys representing 35 Scout troops  
 scattered over southern Ontario, in-  
 cluding 17 Toronto troops.

The Scout Forest was begun in  
 1929, on land leased by the provin-  
 cial Scout Association. The  
 trees started in that year are now  
 considerably taller than the lads  
 who planted them. In all a half  
 million trees have been planted in  
 the Scout Forest and adjacent areas  
 by a total of some 700 Scouts.

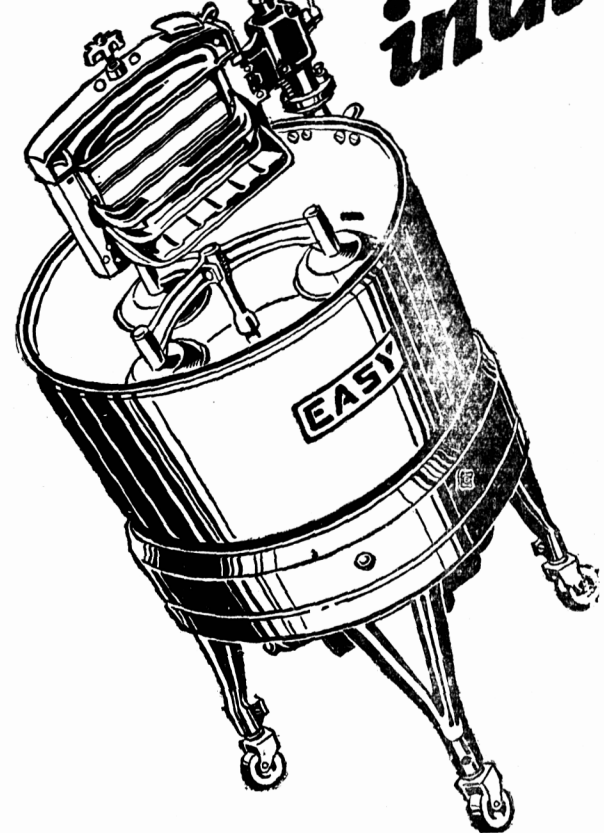

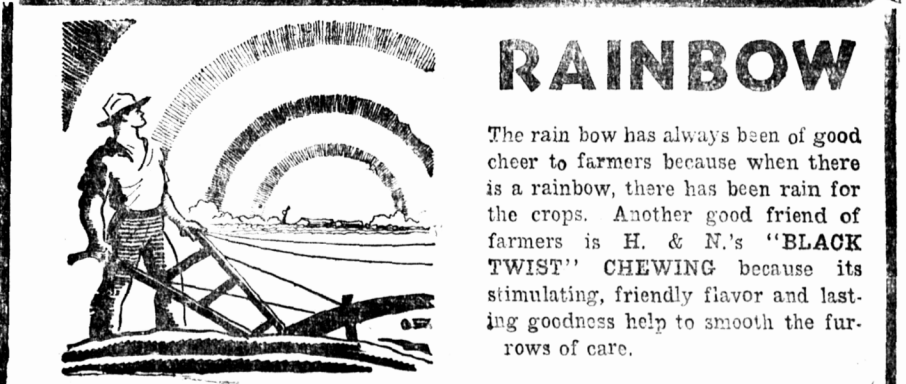

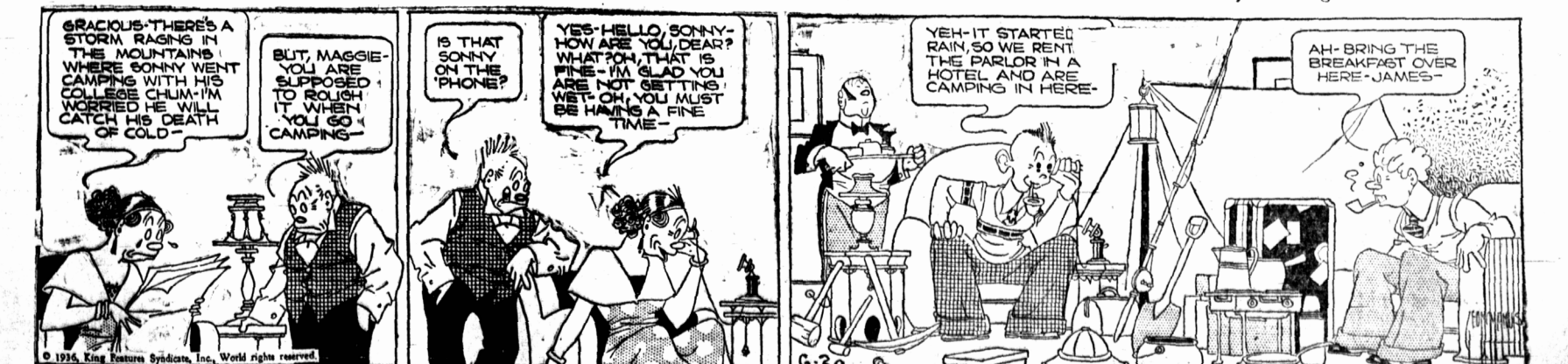
