Four little maids from the musical comedy school are coming to Charlottetown this summer to add their beauty and talent to the 1966 Festival of Music and Laughter.

Best known to Charlottetown audiences is Judy Armstrong, the dark-haired singer-dancer-actress, who played fun-loving Irma La Douce. She was back on the Island last summer as an instructor at the North Rustico fine arts summer school, while her husband, Christopher Banks, was on Confederation Centre's production staff.

Judy's most recent assignments include work in "Ligging About" a hit revue in Toronto, and guest appearances in Hollywood on "The Danny Kaye Show" and "The John Gary Show".

Jane Casson, a fair-haired funny girl, came to Toronto from Australia less than a year ago, and this season played in "Mr. Scrooge", "Hay Fever" and "The Physicists". She has been involved in theatre since she played in Macbeth in the Glasgow Citizens Theatre at the age of seven, and has played many character roles in Australia and England. In the Charlottetown Festival, she will play Peggy in "The Adventures of Private Turvey".

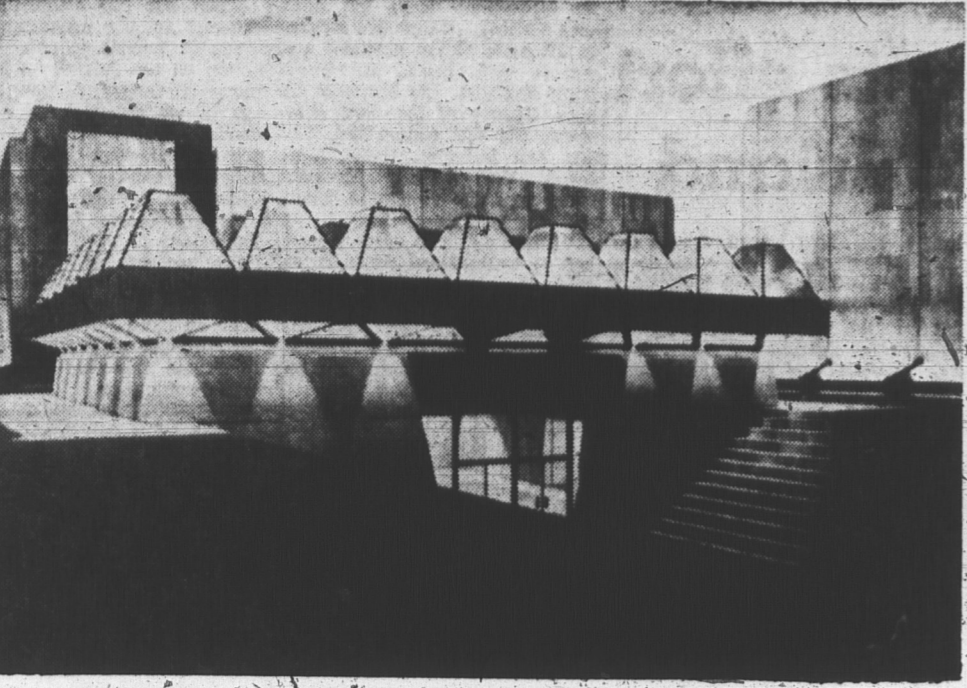

COVENTRY, England (CP)—Europe's tallest lamp post has been erected in Coventry's Station Square. Eighty feet tall and carrying four 1,000-watt lamps, it replaces 12 conventional lamp posts.

MAKE LAW ON LIGHTS

LONDON (CP)—Automobile headlights are to be made obligatory in Britain for the first time this fall. Present law requires only sidelights for identification after dark. The new regulations also prohibit yellow headlights, standard in several European countries.

Variety of events will be available

Prince Edward Island's "Calendar of Events" for the summer of 1966 includes a wide variety of recreational and entertainment activities according to Hon. Lloyd G. MacPhail, Minister of Tourist Development.

To date scheduled summer events include the following:

- JUNE**
- Provincial Inter-Scholastic Track and Field Championships at Summerside.
- JULY**
- July 1 to Sept. 4 — Festival of Music and Laughter at the Confederation Centre in Charlottetown featuring the following plays: Anne of Green Gables, The Ottawa Man, the Adventures of Private Turvey and a series of Sunday night concerts.
 - 6 — Fisheries Exhibition and Regatta, Souris. An early season event, the exhibition features a parade, the Queen of the Sea coronation ball, a lobster or chicken barbecue supper at the wharf, boat races, plays, boat races, water sports and a visit from a large naval vessel.
 - 6 — Annual Convention P.E.I. Women's Institute, Charlottetown. Visiting W.I. members welcome.
 - 7 — Egmont Bay Exhibition. A rural farm exhibition in the heart of an Acadian area. Island Handicraft, including hooked rugs are featured. Special games and refreshments.
 - 12 — The Summerside Lobster Carnival and Livestock Exhibition. Originated in 1955, presents a diversity of entertainment, contests, a Maritime Track and Field Meet, games, and harness horse racing. There is also a livestock show, a fisheries and handicraft display. Each day is topped off by a big lobster supper. Another highlight is the Miss P.E.I. Contest.
 - 12 — Open Provincial AAU of C. Track and Field Championships at Charlottetown.
 - 14 — Provincial Rose Show at Parkdale.
 - 15-16 — Charlottetown Shediac Yacht Race. 1966 will be the third year for this popular event. Each year the race is run in the opposite direction, this year it will start in Shediac.
 - 20-22 — Strawberry Festival at Montague. Inaugurated in 1964, features daily suppers at which the main item is the strawberry. Entertainment including a mammoth parade and sports. One of the highlights is the crowning of the Strawberry Queen at the Coronation Ball, the final evening.
 - 27 — Alberton Regatta. In addition to the full program of water sports, boat racing and swimming, there is a three mile swim. There are many other features during Alberton's summer festive day.
 - 27 (1) — Village Day, St. Peter's Bay.
 - 29-31 — National Sailing Regatta at Charlottetown. Canadian Flying Junior Organization.
 - July 29 — August 7 — Scottish Festival, North Rustico. The Scottish Festival features the Lovat Scots Pipe Band and Dancers in daily concerts, outdoor stage, and if weather is unfavourable, indoors. The best in Scottish band selections, music and Highland Dancing highlight these shows.
 - 31 — St. Anne's Day, Lennox Island. This annual gathering on the Micmac Indian reservation just off Port Hill provides entertainment for a Sunday afternoon. A religious service in the morning starts the day off. In the afternoon the program includes among other things, games, contests and picnics.

Surgeon turns play writer

HALIFAX (CP) — Once well into his practice, Dr. Arthur Lister Murphy believes, a physician must establish some rapport with his patients and understand their problems.

"It gives him a broader experience into people's deeper emotional problems," says Dr. Murphy, a surgeon who wrote radio plays to stay alive during the depression years and now writes as a lucrative hobby.

Dr. Murphy, who has sold plays to United States television producers, says the surgeon can teach the writer.

"One learns strict discipline from surgery—you get into the habit of doing what you must do when you must do it."

Dr. Murphy—a professor of surgery at Dalhousie University and staff member of two hospitals—here has completed his first light play, the three-character comedy The Sleeping Bag scheduled to have its premiere at the Neptune Theatre July 19. The Sleeping Bag, set in the Arctic, is "not a very serious triangle—it's simple... with a cast of two men and a woman."
