

Research Centre at Hampton, Va. They were taken by Orbiter II Nov. 23 when the spacecraft was 29 1/2 miles above the moon's surface and 180 miles due south of the centre of Copernicus. They are the first close-up pictures of the Copernicus crater, 80 miles across and two miles deep, on the upper left quarter of the moon as seen from the earth. FORMED BY METEORITE NASA scientists said it was

formed by the impact of a giant meteorite which ejected the angular blocks, up to 150 feet across, that surround the crater rim. In one picture, taken by Orbiter's telephoto lens, a ledge of bedrock is visible in the central part of the mountain chain on the crater floor. That picture shows a part of the crater and its mountain back-drop 17 miles wide and 150 miles from the horizon to the base of the photograph.

Another shot of an area extending 180 miles from base to horizon shows the floor of Copernicus in fine detail. It also shows keyhole-shaped crater Fauth, 13 miles across and 4500 feet deep, 33 miles south of Copernicus. NASA identified a triangular-shaped flat area in the foreground of the picture as a fault trough, filled by young volcanic rocks. Baby Budget Scheduled By Christmas

OTTAWA (CP)—Finance Minister Sharp has suggested that only a Commons delay on legislation could cause him to postpone bringing down a baby budget before Christmas. He informed Stanley Knowles (NDP—Winnipeg North Centre)

that he still intends to proceed before Christmas though he might have to change his mind if no progress is made on legislation. Mr. Knowles also asked whether Mr. Sharp might reconsider plans to raise or impose new taxes to pay for old age pension supplements. Mr. Sharp said a chief reason for the baby budget is to raise money for the pension supplement which has yet to go through its preliminary legislative stages. Mr. Knowles suggested that a

surplus in the old age pension fund makes it unnecessary to raise taxes to pay for the supplement. Prime Minister Pearson entered the verbal exchange to inform Davis Fulton (PC—Kamloops) that the pension supplement bill has been ready for some time. The Commons has not dealt yet with a resolution which would allow the government to introduce the bill. Mr. Fulton was ruled out of order when he asked Mr. Pearson when the first cheques for
