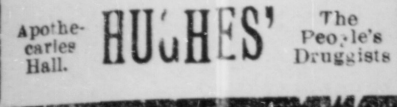

Influenced by Medical Advisers

One of the Scraps.

LONDON, Oct. 30.—The war office has received the following from Lord Roberts, dated Pretoria, Oct. 28:

"Knox successfully engaged De Wet Oct 27. During the Boer retreat, Knox caught DeWet in the Rensburg Drift. The Boers lost considerably and left two guns and three wagons in Knox's hands. Another ammunition wagon was blown up by a shell. The British casualties were nil."

—The annual meeting of the Charlottetown Young Men's Christian Association was held last evening. Mr. Fraser Marshall, Maritime Secretary, and Mr. A. W. Robb were present. The President Mr. J. D. Seaman, referred to the discouraging state of the institution, and thought a secretary absolutely necessary for its welfare. The selling of the building was discussed and met with opposition. Mr. Marshall strongly discountenancing the scheme. Messrs W. C. Turner, J. T. McKenzie and J. D. Seaman were appointed a committee to secure a loan of \$5000 at five per cent to clear the present indebtedness and to improve the building. The work of the committee will begin at once.
