

# Red China Is Blocked On United Nations Try

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP)  
Red China's chances of getting into the United Nations were killed for another year Tuesday despite a last-minute plea by India's V. K. Krishna Menon.

The 82-member General Assembly voted 44 to 29 with nine abstentions in backing a United States resolution sidetracking for a year the China question which has become a perennial before the UN. Canada voted with the majority.

There were few differences from last year when the vote on an identical resolution was 44 to 28 with nine abstentions—the assembly then having just 81 members. Guinea, the new member, voted against the U.S. stand Tuesday.

## Laos Mention Is Avoided

VIENTIANE, Laos (CP)—The government disclosed Tuesday without explanation that it avoided accusing North Viet Nam of aggression in documents laid before United Nations fact-finders.

Instead, an announcement said, a 20-page document simply charged a foreign state with fomenting internal disorders in Laos and threatening its sovereignty. A spokesman declined to make an explanation.

(There were indications Laos may be shifting its charge to Communist China. In the United Nations, Laos accused China of masterminding rebel operations.)

The government had accused North Viet Nam of backing Communist rebels in Sam Neua and Phong Saly provinces of northern Laos and asked the UN for armed help. The charge sent a four-power subcommittee from the UN security council to Laos.

The government said a directive issued to the Laotian committee, which prepared the documents for the UN subcommittee, merely accused North Viet Nam of making false charges against Laos.

But the directive did not cite the North Vietnamese in connection with its charges of actual subversion within Laos, the government added.

A UN spokesman said the subcommittee is studying the documents' "sentence by sentence" while it waits for Laos to corroborate the charges.

Meantime, the already tricky job of reporting the rebel war became even more difficult Tuesday when the government banned newspaper men from the key fighting area of Sam Neua province.

The government said some correspondents were not writing the facts "in a correct way."
