- Apr. 9 to 15** - National Wildlife Week with the theme "*Migration - An Incredible Journey*" and Earth Week.
- April 15** - Birders are invited to join the Seabird Monitoring project using observations points on the coast of Prince Edward Island. - Apr. 22** - The Natural History Society will host an Owl Hoot. Car pool from the Farm Centre in Charlottetown at 9:30 pm for this 2 to 2.5 hour outing to use taped calls to attract owl responses.
