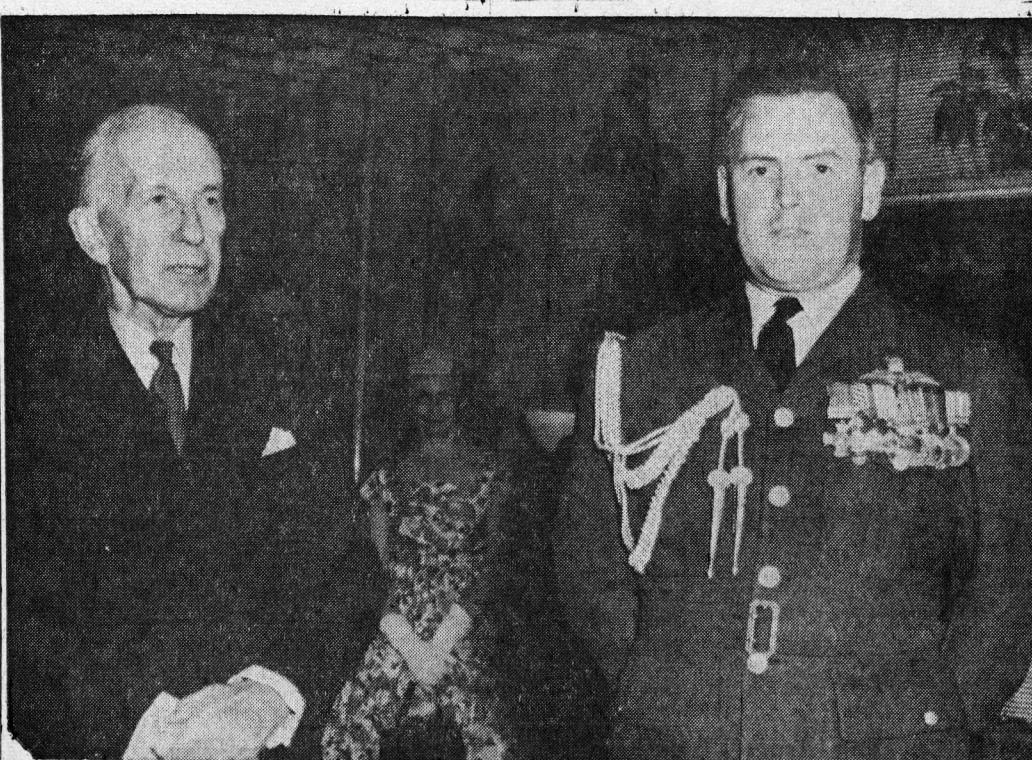

**Fire Causes Damage In Warehouse At St. Louis**

A fire in a warehouse at the rear of Frank J. Shea's store in St. Louis burned for over two hours last evening despite strenuous efforts by the Tignish and Alberton Fire Departments and a volunteer bucket brigade.  
Although flooded with water the stubborn blaze continued to burn in the walls and underneath the floor of the 30 x 20 building. A large stock of general merchandise which included rubber footwear and asphalt shingles added fuel to the flames.  
Only fifteen yards separated the warehouse from the main store but it was not in danger at any time.  
Water for the bucket brigade was obtained from a flooded basement in the store.  
Practically all contents of the building were considered a complete loss and damage to the warehouse itself was extensive.  
The amount of insurance and cause of the blaze could not be learned last night.

**Reassessment In Summerside Said Nearing Completion**

The new reassessment in the town of Summerside is now nearing completion Councillor W. E. MacCausland, chairman of the finance committee, told the Summerside Town Council last evening at their regular May meeting.  
The real estate and personal assessment has already been finished, indicating an approximate 60 percent increase in valuation, as the result of the evaluators applying a standard method of appraisal to all property. The assessors are now completing the evaluation of stock in trade, and this should be completed within the next ten days.  
While the total assessment roll will be substantially increased, naturally the tax rate will be lowered to produce the required amount of revenue necessary to operate the various departments of town government, and the only rate payers who will be adversely affected, he said are those, who in the past, have enjoyed an assessment not in keeping with the value of their property.  
A considerable amount of work has been done on the budget, and the finance chairman felt that when the assessment is completed the council will be in a position to hold their annual budget meeting.

**The R.C.A.F. Summerside Station Soccer Club**

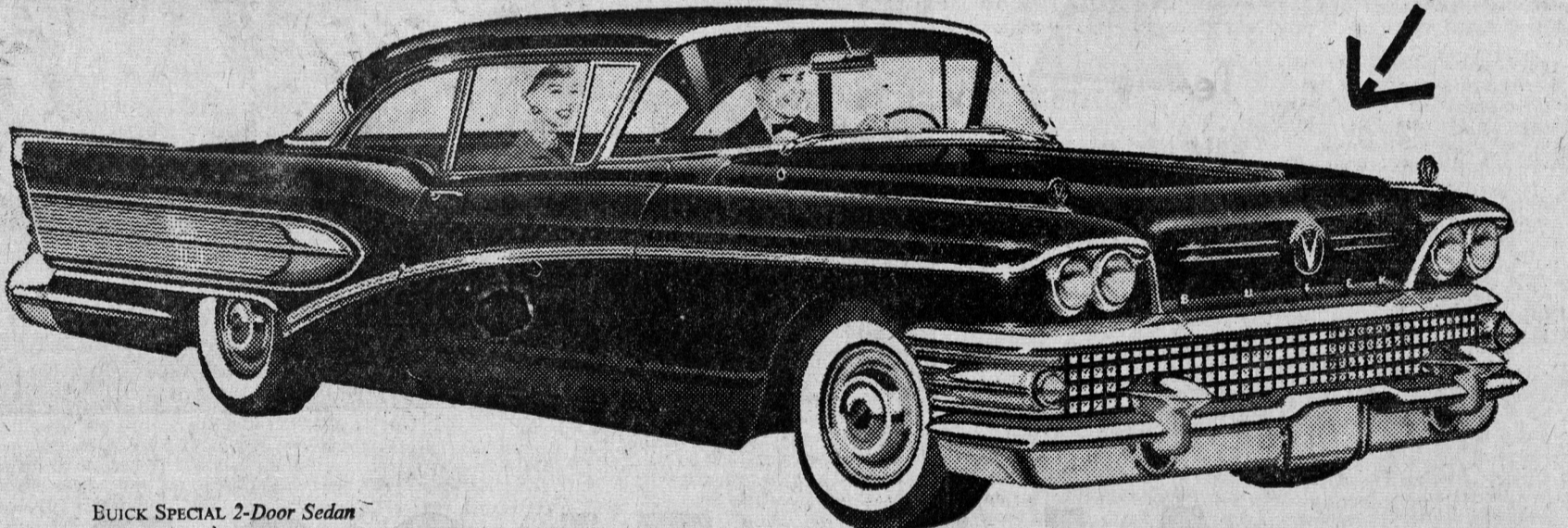
