member of CIMN. He has also worked on every other Student Union committee except two.

Gordon does not plan to run the position much differently than it has been run in the past. He realizes that change is difficult, but he feels he could run the present operation efficiently. Gordon is not content with the present Student Union facilities, but there is "little else we can do with our present financial situation." Gordon isn't running

in the by-election because he doesn't want to take office immediately.

Tom Hayward is a Senior in psychology who wants to represent students better than they are now. He feels that there is no reason why students can't get to know each other in a community such as this. Tom has no real experience with the S.U. but he hopes to gain a lot but running in the by-election then he can apply

next year. He will assist in making sure that capable people are placed as heads of the various sub-organizations. He is in favour, also, of a personnel board.

Marilyn MacPherson, a senior in Chemistry, and the former Vice-President is running in the by-election for a vote of confidence. She feels that her impeachment was just because she had missed four council meetings but that attending meetings was not her major

function. "People go to council meetings and don't take anything back to their electorate". Marilyn feels that she did this. She feels that she was called upon to do the job of Communications Officer and was impeached because of the conflict. Marilyn retains an interest in the Student Union and, even if she doesn't win, she intends to continue to work with the Student Union and help the new V. P. all she can.

## COMPTROLLER

There are three Candidates running in the election for the position of Comptroller. These are: Bill Chandler, a Junior in Science, majoring in physics; Eugene Kenny, a Sophomore in Arts, majoring in history; and Bob Thompson, a Junior in Arts, also majoring in history. The comptroller is directly responsible for the Campus Police, the Barn, and all the S.U. property.

All three believe they are qualified for the job. Bill Chandler has experience as a Science Representative on the Student Council and works in the Barn with the Barn cafeteria staff.

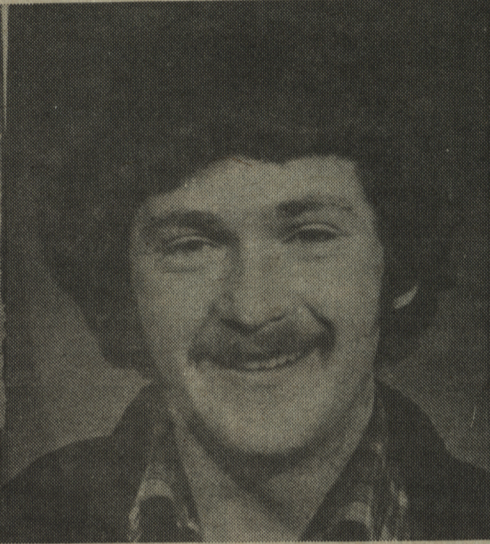
Gene Kenny is now a member of the campus police force. Bob Thompson worked on the bar in the Panther Lounge last year and is a member of the campus police force this year.

As the comptroller is directly responsible for the campus police, we asked each of them what they thought on the subject.

Bill Chandler said that "there is definite room for improvement and one way to do it is to

have tighter controls."

By having tighter controls he means that the C.P.'s need a better job description. At the present moment, he added,

they have no definite duties besides those of watching the door and picking up beer bottles. Damage is hard to control because the C.P.'s do have "a big enough job as it is to watch all places at all times therefore damages are bound to happen." The Barn is cheaply built and it doesn't take much to kick a hole in the wall.

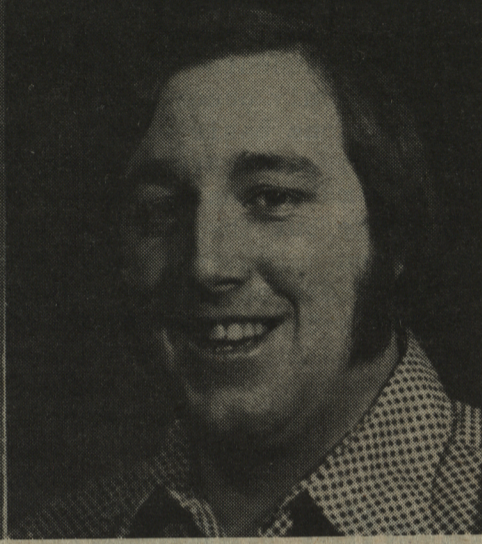
Gene Kenny said, "the campus police were not well organized this year" and that if they had a better working relationship they would function more smoothly. He would also like to have a say in who becomes chief of the campus police next year.

Bob Thompson said, "there were a few problems this year but I've worked within the system and I think I know how to combat them." One problem was that they didn't have a strong leader which took away from their effectiveness.

He also plans to monitor the Personnel Board to get in as chief, the person he feels is the best qualified for the position.

We asked what changes, if any, they would like to see in the Barn.

Bill said that to make any major changes in the physical appearance of the Barn would cost a lot of money. There is also the

question of whether or not it would be worth it. He would like to see new furniture and a few comfortable lounge chairs installed.

Gene would like to see the number of staff in the Cafeteria change and see to it that the damages occurring in the Barn were stopped before they happen. For instance, he said that the pipes in the men's washroom could be boxed off to insure no further damages occur. He said as well that with the expenditure they have now, improvements on the Barn are not feasible.

Bob would like to see the Panther Lounge open all the time with a T.V., a few decks of cards and a crib board. He feels that this would encourage people to congregate in the Barn.

We questioned each of them on the possibility of using the old library as a S.U. Building.

Bill said that "as long as the University doesn't know what they're going to do with it, the idea is not far-fetched at all." It would be cheaper than trying to build a new building.

Gene said, "that it would be a good step to get it all under one roof." He admits that he thinks

it is far-fetched financially-speaking.

Bob doesn't think the old library is suitable for a number of reasons. He says that libraries were built to deaden sound and that the acoustics would be horrible for groups that were playing. He also thinks that there would not be enough room for a pig 'n' whistle.

The final question asked was, what will they do if they were comptroller.

Bill said that he would "tighten up and improve the Campus Police; would look for ways to improve services of the Barn to students; and would look into the idea of hiring a full-time Barn Manager perhaps on a percentage basis, to run the whole Barn including the Cafeteria and the bar." As a member of the Executive he would work with other members of the executive trying to improve the image of the Student Union.

Gene said he intends to work primarily with the Campus Police. If they run smoothly, the Barn will to. Also he feels that the Barn should be repaired.

Bob said that the lack of spirit at U.P.E.I. bothers him and he would like to do something about it, such as having pep rallies for athletics, a one to one situation with council, He plans to spend at least 10 hours in the Office a week. He would also like to see the Student Union take a stand on campus related issues and to help anyone else in difficulty. The tactics of the business Office also bothers him. He feels that it is too rigid and its policy of paying fees by cash or money order are not acceptable. He would like the Student Union to have its own booth at registration to take the \$40.00 fee and then give the O.K. to register.
